CEO Statement Q4

Careium reported growth and strong cash flow in the fourth quarter. Net sales increased 6.3 percent adjusted for currency. Importantly, our free cash flow improved to SEK 30.4 million (16.6). We have also started several initiatives to unlock Careium's market potential.

We delivered growth despite the impact of financial lease classifications in Sweden. Product sales increased 6.5 percent to SEK 67.1 million (63.0), while service sales decreased 1.3 percent to SEK 163.8 million (165.9). As previously communicated, longer sales cycles affected product sales in Germany and the UK.

For the full year, net sales grew 9.3 percent (adjusted for currency and classifications of financial leases), gross margin amounted to 43.9 percent, and we generated SEK 41.2 million in free cash flow. In the quarter, gross margin amounted to 43.7 percent (44.4), but operating profit decreased to SEK 8.3 million (26.5).

Having been the interim CEO for almost six months, I can conclude that there are room for improvements integrating all of Careium's European operations. We are now taking actions to improve structural capital that will provide long term efficiencies.

Therefore, we have started a number of initiatives to integrate historic acquisitions and align our businesses. This affected operating margins in the quarter and is expected to do so throughout the first half of 2026. We believe that these measures will create significant value over time.

Firstly, we are modernising our technology to build a more scalable care platform. Secondly, we focus on improving our structural capital by integrating various operations and processes to better align our different markets. And thirdly, we are improving our product offering to become more customer-centric, having a more unified approach across our markets.

During this quarter we have also phased out some outdated assets.

As previously announced, Careium has onboarded a large customer in Norway, resulting in upfront costs and margin pressure in the quarter. We estimate this effect will decrease from Q2 and onward. Already from the first quarter of 2026,

the impact of financial lease classifications in Sweden will be significantly reduced, which will have a positive impact on net sales and overall margins.

The aim is to build a unified modern European health tech company with a scalable care platform.

We build the company for the long-haul as we are a leader in a multi-decade growth industry. We have a strong position in several key European markets and bridgeheads in markets with large populations. The populations are aging and the care industry is being transformed with technology. We aim to tap into this growth with a renewed and efficient operating model, standing on a stable foundation as a large portion of our revenues are recurring with long customer contracts.

Our strong market position creates opportunities for organic as well as non-organic growth in a fragmented landscape. We are well positioned to take an active role in the consolidation. However, we will tread diligently, looking for complementary businesses with clear synergies.

During the second quarter 2026, our new permanent CEO Tove Christiansson will join. Bringing vast experience from our industry, she will continue to build Careium as a unified and modern European health tech company.

Financials

For the quarter, Careium's net sales increased 0.9 percent to SEK 230.9 million (228.9). Adjusted for currency effects, sales increased 6.3 percent and adjusted for both currency and financial leases classifications, sales increased 13.1 percent.

Product sales increased 6.5 percent to SEK 67.1 million (63.0) and service sales declined 1.3 percent to SEK 163.8 million (165.9). Reported service sales was held back in Sweden by fewer new financial lease classifications. As previously communicated, the UK and Germany reported lower product sales than expected.

For the full-year, net sales decreased 1.9 percent to 854.1 SEK million (870.7). Adjusted for currency effects, sales increased 0.9 percent and adjusted for both currency and financial lease classifications, sales increased 9.3 percent.

The number of connections was 336,000 (329,800) at the end of the period.

Profitability

Careium's gross margin amounted to 43.7 percent (44.4) for the quarter. Gross profit increased in all regions except UK and Ireland. For the full-year, the gross margin increased to 43.9 percent (42.9).

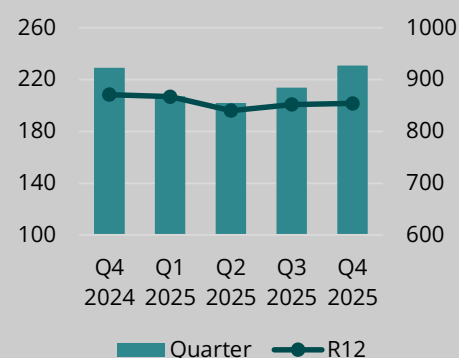
EBIT decreased to SEK 8.3 million (26.5), resulting in an EBIT margin of 3.6 percent (11.6). EBIT was affected by increased headcount in sales and development as well as initiatives for future efficiency. In addition, a number of outdated assets were phased out, which resulted in short-term margin pressure.

EBITDA amounted to SEK 27.0 million (43.8).

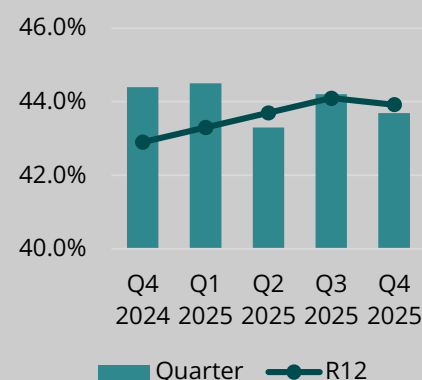
Net financial items totaled SEK -2.1 million (0.4) whereof net interest amounted to SEK -0.8 million (-1.2). Group tax was SEK 7.0 million (-4.4).

Profit for the period amounted to 13.2 million (22.5).

Cash flow

Careium's cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK 69.4 million (35.1) during the quarter. For the full-year, cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK 143.4 million (92.9).

Investments during the quarter were SEK 39.0 million (18.6) of which SEK 21.4 million (10.3) were in tangible fixed assets, as a lower number of contracts were classified as financial leases.

Free cash flow amounted to SEK 30.4 million (16.6) following improved working capital.

Cash and cash equivalents totaled SEK 54.9 million (31.9) at the end of the quarter.

The company is well-financed, with sufficient cash position and access to a credit facility to facilitate further investments.

The equity ratio was 62.6 percent (64.6).

Net debt amounted to SEK 154.8 million (164.9).

Significant events during the period

On December 2, Tove Christiansson was appointed CEO, effective Q2 2026. She succeeds interim CEO Peter Heuman, who will remain in his current role until the transition has been completed.

On December 11, it was announced that given the development in Germany and the UK, Careium did not expect to meet the previous guidance for the full year 2025.

Significant events after the period

On January 12, Alexander Golubev was appointed Interim CTO, replacing Alexander Jubner.

On January 19, following changes in shareholdings, Louis So (Kunshan Q Technology International) replaced Mark Shay (Accendo Capital) as a member of the Nomination Committee.

Outlook

Careium does not provide financial guidance.

Highlights by region

Careium's net sales amounted to SEK 230.9 million (228.9) in the quarter. The Nordics accounted for 44 percent (41), the UK for 33 percent (35) the Netherlands for 10 percent (10) and other markets (mainly Germany and France) for 13 percent (14).

Careium operates across Sweden, Norway and Denmark, with a combined offering of products, services and software. Customers are mainly public entities.

Net sales in the Nordics increased 7.0 percent to SEK 101.1 million (94.5) in the quarter. Service sales increased to SEK 93.4 million (87.6) and product sales increased to SEK 7.7 million (6.9).

For the full-year, net sales decreased by 9.1 percent to SEK 357.7 million (393.7) with declines in both service sales and product sales.

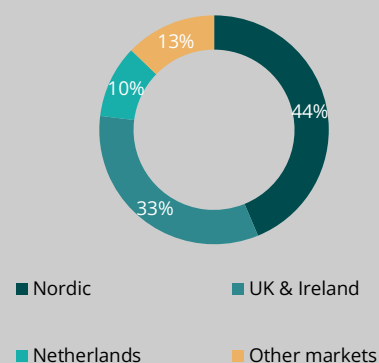
However, adjusted for impact of financial lease classifications, net sales increased 25.3 percent in the quarter and 9.6 percent in the full year.

The most common solution is a bundled package of services and products for an agreed period (usually 3-6 years) that entails a recurring revenue per end user. If the contract is classified as financial lease, the hardware is booked up-front according to IFRS 15 and IFRS 16 in Sweden. This has no effect on the cash flow.

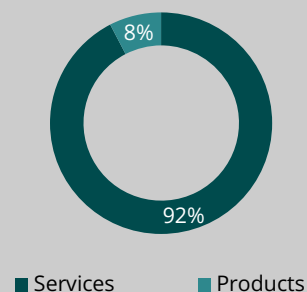
During the quarter, SEK 1.7 million of hardware deliveries in Sweden were classified as financial leases and booked as sales upfront, compared to SEK 15.2 million in the fourth quarter 2024. This implies a direct negative impact of SEK 13.5 million on net sales. From the first quarter of 2026, the impact of financial lease accounting will be significantly reduced.

Gross margin amounted to 39.5 percent (35.9) for the quarter.

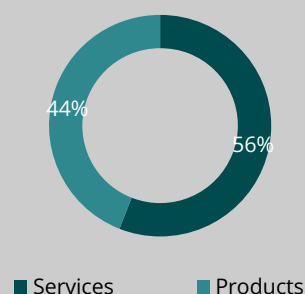
In the UK & Ireland, Careium operates the full range of our offering with hardware and integrated services. While most of the offering entails recurring services revenue with bundled hardware, software and services, the UK has a large share of product agreements.

Net sales in the United Kingdom and Ireland decreased 5.2 percent to SEK 76.6 million (80.8) in the quarter. Service sales decreased 16.4 percent to SEK 42.9 million (51.3) negatively impacted by currency effect. Quarter on quarter service sales increased 5.7 percent. Product sales was affected by longer sales cycles and still increased 14.2 percent to SEK 33.7 million (29.5).

Gross margin decreased to 34.8 percent (43.1) for the quarter. The decline can partly be explained by timing of accruals between quarters during 2025.

For the full-year, net sales increased by 1.7 percent to SEK 312.7 million (307.6) with growth in product sales.

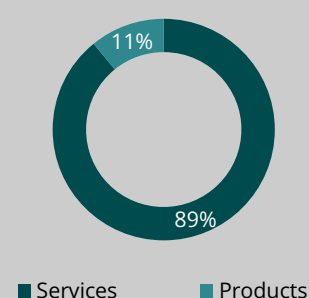

The Netherlands is a relatively advanced technology enabled care market. In the market, Careium is centered on recurring service sales, meaning that stand-alone product sales comprise only a fraction of the business.

Net sales in the Netherlands increased 8.8 percent to SEK 23.7 million (21.8) in the quarter. Gross margin increased to 64.2 percent (62.8).

For the full-year, net sales increased by 7.7 percent to SEK 88.4 million (82.1).

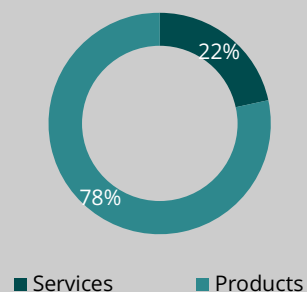
In other markets (mainly Germany and France), Careium has entered organically mainly focused on product sales.

Net sales in other markets decreased 7.2 percent to SEK 29.5 million (31.8) following longer sales cycles in Germany. Gross margin increased to 64.9 percent (60.7).

For the full-year, net sales increased by 9.0 percent to SEK 95.2 million (87.3).

Our business in this region is smaller and focused on product sales. Therefore, it is more likely to be affected by variations between the quarters, where for example a major order (or lack of it) can swing the outcome for a quarter.

Other Information

Dividend

The Board of Directors will propose to the Annual General Meeting that no dividend will be paid for 2025.

Equity and the Careium share

Careium's share is listed on Nasdaq First North Growth Market. On 31 December 2025, the number of issued shares (all common shares) were 24,326,214. The company has an employee stock option program with a maximum of 600,000 options, corresponding to a potential dilution of 2.4%.

On December 31, the share price was SEK 23.80 (30.30) corresponding to a market capitalization of SEK 579.0 million (737.1). Total equity was SEK 681.5 million (678.2).

Nomination Committee

The Nomination Committee for the 2026 Annual General Meeting consists of Peter Lindell (Cidro Förvaltning), Louis So (Kunshan Q Technology), Mats Hellström (Nordea Funds) and Juha Mört (Chairman of the Board, adjunct member).

Employees

On 31 December 2025, Careium had 562 (567) full-time equivalents. Of these, 274 (247) were based in the Nordic region, 47 (44) in the Netherlands, 221 (257) in the United Kingdom and Ireland, and 22 (18) in the other markets.

Risks

Careium's position is affected by operational, strategic, financial, and sustainability risks. Across the four main categories of risk, ranking of most critical risks consists of:

Strategic: Commercial failure, integration of acquisitions, changing legal requirements

Operational: Cyber security, service continuity, supply chain disturbances

Sustainability: Occupational health and safety risks, supply chain environmental impact, corruption

Financial risks: Credit and counterparty risk, liquidity risk, currency risks

While listed as an operational risk, cyber security is managed not just as part of risk assessments and action but integrated in the work of IT operations. For more information, see the section about risks in the Annual Report 2024.

Parent company

The parent company's net sales amounted to SEK 2.8 million (3.7) in the quarter. Net profit amounted to SEK 12.9 million (19.2).

Accounting principles

This report has been prepared for the group in accordance with IAS 34. "Interim Financial Reporting" and for the parent company in accordance with the Swedish Annual Accounts Act and the Swedish Financial Reporting Board's recommendation RFR 2. "Accounting for legal entities". The accounting principles and calculation methods applied correspond to those that were used to prepare the most recent annual report. IFRS 2 is applied to the employee stock option program that was decided at the Annual General Meeting on April 24, 2025.

Employee stock options granted to employees are recognized as an expense in the income statement with a corresponding increase in equity, based on the estimated fair value of the options at grant date. The valuation has been made using the Black & Scholes model. The cost of employee stock options is allocated over the vesting period. The company continuously assess the number of options expected to vest and adjusts the cost accordingly.

Social security contributions are calculated on the fair value of vested employee stock options and are recognized as an expense in the income statement and as a liability in the balance sheet as the related cost of the compensation is recognized.

Accounting of Employee Stock Option Program 2025

On April 24, 2025, Careium implemented an employee stock option program to ensure commitment for senior management employees through a remuneration system linked to the company's future value growth. The employee stock option program comprises a maximum of 600,000 employee stock options (maximum dilution 2.4%). The employee stock options shall be allotted free of charge. Each employee stock option entitles the holder to acquire, provided that the barrier and ceiling conditions are met, one share in Careium for a subscription price corresponding to the share's quota value. The employee stock options vest after three years. For detailed information, see www.careium.com/en/investor-relations/annual-general-meeting

Fair value of the options is calculated with the Black & Scholes model adjusted for barriers and cap. At grant date (May 28, 2025), the employee stock option was valued at SEK 19.77 based on the following parameters: the risk-less interest rate 1.94%, value of the underlying share 27.5 SEK, duration of the option 3 years, barrier 36.84 SEK, cap 70.00 SEK and volatility 40.3%.

A total of 335,000 stock options is granted to senior executives and 265,000 stock options remain in the option pool.

Operating profit was negatively impacted by SEK 0.7 million in the quarter and SEK 1.6 million for the full-year related to the employee stock option program.
