The Norclic Ski Report 2023/24



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I think we all saw the pictures and videos last winter. Skiers in some of the most expensive ski resorts in the Alps skiing on thin strips of icy or muddy snow. Ski resorts shut down or running at limited capacity well over halfway into the season. Headlines like "the worst skiing season in the Alps in living memory" made global news, while videos of people skiing on grass went viral on social media. TikTok influencers had a field day making fun of the terrible conditions – the alpine ski resort owners, and the tourism industry in the Alps, did not. While this season has started better in the Alps, ski resorts in other well-established skiing regions (e.g. west coast North America) have been struggling instead.

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Ski resorts with amazing conditions for skiing, in regions with an unexploited property market, that are seeing massive amounts of money being pumped into investments in green infrastructure that, to me, sounds like a match made in heaven.

Meanwhile, we have not seen the same trends in the Nordics - in fact, while summers have become warmer, winters have in many cases become harsher, and the last winter season was no exception. The snow-secure Nordic countries – in this case, primarily Sweden, Norway, and Finland – are also home to over 500 ski resorts, all of which had a normal season last year. Yes, you read that right, 500 resorts – about 8% of all ski resorts globally! Many offer pristine conditions with very limited crowds, as the Nordic region is home to just 20 million people, and 85% of skiers at ski resorts in the Nordics are domestic.

Personally, I love skiing in the Nordics, and have

been to over 30 different resorts myself. But this report is not only about highlighting the untapped potential in terms of actual skiing. Rather, in this report we've tried to also focus in on what Newsec, the largest real estate consultancy in the Nordics, does best - property. The property market in northern Sweden, Norway and Finland is experiencing a new industrialization, which can in many ways be likened to a renaissance. Battery developer Northvolt in Swedish coastal town Skellefteå has paved the way, but over 50 further million- or billion-dollar investments have also been made into regional cities in Sweden alone. Many of these northern areas also happen to be home to some of the aforementioned amazing ski resorts.

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Ski resorts with amazing conditions for skiing, in regions with an unexploited property market that are seeing massive amounts of money being pumped into investments in green infrastructure that, to me, sounds like a match made in heaven. In this report, we've looked at the commercial property market across some of the major skiing markets in the Nordics. We've identified interesting trends and a clear potential across many markets - compared to the Alps, there's huge potential across the board. In many of the smaller resorts not covered in this report, there basically is no commercialized market at all - meaning even more potential. Hidden gems, with amazing IRR, in arguably the most liquid commercial real estate markets in the world - have we piqued your interest? Nordic Market Overview



Tired of the Alps? Look no further than the captivating and snow reliable world of Nordic skiing, where you will discover some of the most exotic and enchanting locations to indulge in winter sport.

In recent years, notably during and following the pandemic, there has been a noteworthy surge in visitors to Nordic ski resorts. As travelers prioritize destinations closer to home and international travelers look to the north, the Nordic regions have experienced a renaissance in popularity. Many have come to appreciate the diverse range of experiences that these secluded destinations can offer to their visitors.

What sets these Nordic ski resorts apart is their remarkably long skiing season. Starting as early as November and stretching all the way through to September, these regions offer an extensive window of opportunity for winter sports enthusiasts. From the crisp, early-season snowfall to the unique experience of glacier skiing in the late summer, the Nordic ski season spans nearly the entire year.

Clear Lack of Industrial Real Estate Space

Untapped potential for industrial properties

In each ski resort, the supply of industrial properties is smaller compared to commercial and residential properties – despite industrial properties being smaller in size than other properties. This indicates a potential investment opportunity in conjunction with the major industrial undertaking in the north.





Nordic Ski Resort Housing Prices - Hemsedal Takes the Summit

In recent years, there has been a noteworthy transformation in the real estate market of Nordic ski resorts, driven by a confluence of factors. The coincidence of pandemic-related restrictions and historically low interest rates has rendered investments in holiday homes increasingly appealing and attainable.

This fortuitous alignment of circumstances has given rise to a surge in the real estate market across these destinations. One notable example of this trend is Åre, Sweden, where housing prices have surged by an impressive 67% between 2019 and 2022, a phenomenon that extends beyond Sweden's borders. In terms of housing prices^{*}, Hemsedal, Norway, topps the list at \notin 6,660 per sqm closely followed by Åre, Sweden at \notin 6,555 per square meter. Taking the third spot is Hafjell at \notin 6,365 per square meter followed by Levi and Trysil at \notin 5,270 respectively \notin 5,205.

Comparatively, these prices are significantly more affordable than those found in the European Alps, where properties can easily exceed €10,000 per square meter. This underscores the value proposition of Nordic ski resorts, offering attractive investment opportunities in breathtaking natural settings without the exorbitant price tags associated with their Alpine counterparts.

Surging Holiday Home Prices



The selling prices of vacation homes in ski resort municipalities across Sweden have exhibited a steady upward trend, occasionally punctuated by minor fluctuations. Since the year 2000, these prices have seen an impressive average growth rate of 506% in the surveyed ski resort municipalities. Notably, Härjedalen municipality, which includes Vemdalen and Funäsfjällen, has witnessed the most substantial surge in prices, with an astounding 568% increase, surging to more than six times its value. Newsec foresees further potential for prices to increase in step with new investments in these regions.
