PC title Fretless releasing on 22 May

Fragbite Group AB's (publ) subsidiary Playdigious is releasing Fretless - The Wrath of Riffson on Steam on 22 May. Fretless is the second and largest PC title to date to be released under the Playdigious Originals business unit and brand. The release date and trailer were presented live last night during the "Future Games Show" at the international Game Developers Conference.

Playdigious Original's second and biggest title to date, *Fretless – The Wrath of Riffson*, will be released on PC via global distribution platform Steam on 22 May. *Fretless* is a rock music themed role-playing game developed by Ritual Studios. The release date and new trailer were presented live last night during the Future Games Show at the international Game Developers Conference in San Francisco. Fretless is based on the music of Rob Scallon and the collaboration with the rock artist is part of the marketing strategy for the game. Additional creative collaborations with artists have been established, with two new partnerships announced yesterday.
