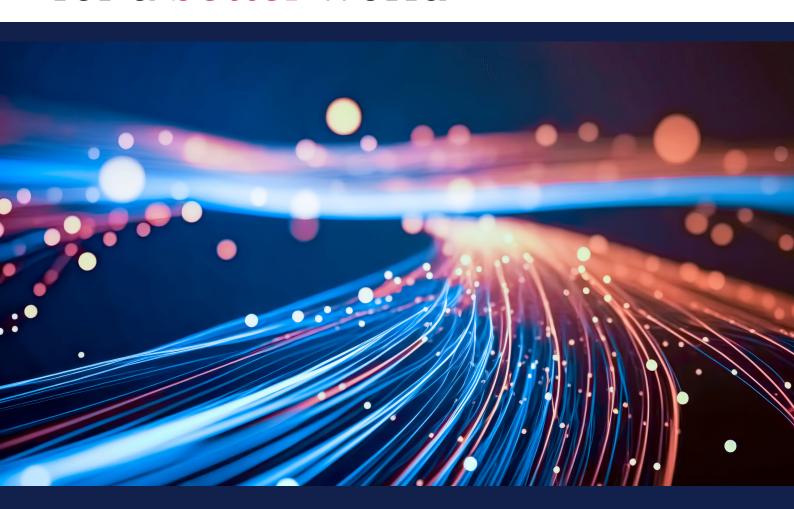

Interim report

1 January – 30 September 2025 Improved earnings and working capital as the transformation continues

The English version of the interim report is a translation of the official Swedish report. In case of discrepancies, the Swedish version shall prevail.

THIRD QUARTER 2025

- Net sales decreased by -11 per cent to SEK 346 (390) million. In unchanged currency, net sales decreased by -9.5 per cent.
- Adjusted operating profit before amortisation of intangible assets (EBITA adjusted) increased by 14 per cent to SEK 23 (20) million. Adjustments of SEK -0.9 (2.5) million relate to SEK 0.3 (0.6) million attributable to unrealised exchange rate gains and losses and SEK -1.2 (1.9) million relates to the revaluation of contingent considerations.
- · Operating profit before amortisation of intangible assets (EBITA) increased by 35 per cent to SEK 24 (18) million.
- Cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK 16 (14) million, corresponding to SEK 0.63 (0.59) per share.
- Earnings per share amounted to SEK 0.37 (0.22).
- The equity ratio increased to 54 per cent from 53 per cent on 30 June 2025.

INTERIM PERIOD JANUARY – SEPTEMBER 2025

- Net sales decreased by -7.2 per cent to SEK 1,127 million (1,215). In unchanged currency, net sales decreased by -5.3 per cent.
- Adjusted operating profit before amortisation of intangible assets (EBITA adjusted) decreased by -16 per cent to SEK 67 million (80). Adjustments of SEK -8.5 (10.8) million relate to SEK -0.7 (1.4) million attributable to unrealised exchange rate gains and losses, SEK -7.8 (7.2) million in revalued and reversed contingent considerations and acquisition costs of SEK 0.0 (2.3) million.
- · Operating profit before amortisation of intangible assets (EBITA) increased by 9.1 per cent to SEK 76 (70) million.
- Cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK 62 (87) million, corresponding to SEK 2.69 (3.66) per share.
- Earnings per share amounted to SEK 1.02 (1.27).
- The equity ratio increased to 54 per cent from 52 per cent on 31 December 2024.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS DURING THE QUARTER

- Inge Dahl has been appointed as the new CEO of Alcadon AS in Norway. He comes most recently from a position as head of the Norwegian sales company of the subsidiary Networks Centre.
- Susanne Stengade, Head of Alcadon Central Europe (Denmark, Germany and Belgium), has decided to leave the Alcadon Group at the end of 2025. The Central Europe region will therefore be phased out, in line with the Group's increased focus on decentralisation.
- André Radley Grundahl has been appointed as the new CEO of Alcadon Denmark and its subsidiary Alcadon Germany. He has extensive experience in sales and leadership from industries such as the automotive, filter and electronics industries, where he has held several CEO positions.
- Piet den Ouden has been appointed as the new CEO of Alcadon Belgium. He comes most recently from the role of sales manager for Alcadon in Benelux and has extensive experience from the network infrastructure industry, including roles at Alcatel Lucent and Sterlite Technologies.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS AFTER THE END OF THE PERIOD

- CFO Niklas Svensson will leave Alcadon Group in early 2026 to take up a similar position in another industry.
- No further significant events have occurred after the end of the period.

A word from the CEO

- · Continued weaker sales but increased margins and reduced costs improve earnings
- · Further inventory adjustments to meet new market conditions free up working capital as planned
- New management in subsidiaries in Norway, Denmark, Belgium and Germany broadens future opportunities

DEVELOPMENTS DURING THE QUARTER

Also the third quarter was characterised by continued weak demand in the broadband segment in most of our markets, while the data center segment continued to develop positively. Our exposure to broadband, primarily Fibre-to-the-Home (FttH), now accounts for approximately 20 per cent of Alcadon Group's sales, while data centers account for approximately 30 per cent.

The net decrease in sales is also partly a consequence of our new financial targets, where we actively encourage our subsidiaries to prioritise business with stronger gross margins and lower capital tied up over volume transactions with intense price pressure.

Alcadon Group reports an adjusted EBITA of SEK 23.2 million in the third quarter, which is an improvement versus both previous quarters (SEK 22.2 million in the second quarter and SEK 21.8 million in the first quarter) as well as versus previous year (SEK 20.5 million). Despite continued restructuring measures, we delivered both stronger gross margins and lower costs in the quarter. The earnings margin thus improved to 6.7 per cent (5.2).

We are generating a stable cash flow and continuing to reduce inventory, which is now SEK 50 million lower than previous year and almost SEK 20 million lower than the previous quarter. Inventory turnover is increasing and working capital has improved by just over SEK 20 million compared with previous year. However, our most important financial target, P/WC, is lower at the end of the quarter than previous year due to weaker earnings in recent quarters, but has improved compared to the previous quarter. The debt ratio remains within the

limits of our fourth financial target.

The Group's biggest challenge continues to be the markets in Europe that are most exposed to FttH rollouts that are not gaining the momentum that was expected. Our German operations in particular are affected by tough competition around the few projects coming onto the market, but also by internal history of high risk-taking in product purchasing and sales.

We have therefore initiated a structural change during the quarter, discontinuing Region Central Europe and introducing new leadership closer to the operations in both Germany, Denmark, and Belgium, while further adjusting cost levels in the aforementioned entities. We will continue to evaluate the potential in these markets while further reducing slow-moving inventory, likely at the expense of gross margin and operating profit, but with a positive cash flow contribution.

We have also introduced a new CEO for Alcadon Norway, who is now taking over a business where we during spring and summer have adjusted staffing, costs and inventory levels to new market conditions, in parallel with the launch of a targeted initiative towards the growing data center segment.

The transformation work that was initiated during spring with the aim of strengthening decentralisation and target-based management towards our subsidiaries and increasing responsibility for their own business is not yet fully completed, but we have come a long way and thus laid the foundation for Alcadon Group's next step on the journey towards the vision of becoming a leading competence partner in the digitalisation of society.

We have formed strong leadership duos consisting

of the CEO and CFO in all of our subsidiaries, and we have established clear Long Term Target expectations for the future. All companies are now in the process of developing market-specific strategies to achieve these Long-Term Targets, which can be done through both continued organic improvements and, depending on the subsidiary's position in the Focus Model, through value-creating add-on acquisitions.

Properly positioned, with a broader offering in additional niches within the digitalisation of society and with reduced exposure to volatile market segments, Alcadon Group should be well positioned to begin delivering on all our financial targets, not least a more predictable and continuous improvement in operating profit that creates long-term shareholder value.

The United Kingdom

Growth in local currency amounted to 4.2 per cent during the quarter and 6.6 per cent compared with the previous quarter. Our largest subsidiary, Networks Centre Group, with the majority of its operations in the UK, delivered positive sales growth during the quarter, despite continued headwinds in the broadband segment. The trend in commercial properties and data centers thus remains positive. During the quarter, we have simplified the management structure of Networks Centre Group and determined the final earn out following the acquisition in 2022.

Sweden

Growth amounted to -22 per cent during the quarter and -19 per cent compared with the previous quarter. Continued improvement in the product mix, given the increasing share of business in data centers and commercial properties, is strengthening gross margins, which, together with an increased focus on purchasing and inventory optimisation, puts Sweden well-positioned against the new financial targets, despite reduced sales.

The Benelux

Growth in local currency amounted to -14 per cent during the quarter and -19 per cent compared with the previous quarter. Continued high uncertainty surrounding Proximus' acquisition of Fiberklaar and the timing of the competition authorities' approval is having a negative impact on our broadband business. During the quarter, we implemented a structural management change in Belgium, which now reports directly to Group management, and tasked the incoming CEO with broadening the offering in the digitalisation of society and reducing dependence on the broadband segment. In the Netherlands, we are continuing to work on data centers, a niche we also need to develop in Belgium.

Denmark

Growth in local currency amounted to -20 per cent during the quarter and -2.2 per cent compared with the previous quarter. Despite weak sales and much lower demand for broadband, we are seeing some improvement in profitability in Denmark thanks to

increased focus on both costs and inventory. As previously announced, the CEO for Denmark and Germany has decided to leave the Alcadon Group in autumn 2025, five years after the acquisition, and during the quarter we have recruited and begun the introduction of a new CEO, as well as increased our focus on data centers in Denmark.

Germany

Growth in local currency amounted to -4.5 per cent during the quarter and -29 per cent compared with the previous quarter. Our business in Germany remains heavily exposed to the FttH rollout, which has slowed significantly over the past year or so.

During the period, we have further adjusted our operating costs in Germany and continued our work on reducing slow-moving inventory, a process that is progressing more slowly than desired given weak demand even at attractive price levels, and which we therefore expect to continue in the coming quarters.

Ireland

Growth in local currency amounts to -12 per cent compared with the previous year and -9 per cent compared with the previous quarter, both of which were very strong. As is well known, our Irish business is significantly project-based, which can lead to fluctuations in revenue, but at the same time it is one of our most stable companies in terms of profitability, with several interesting data center projects in the pipeline.

Norway

Growth amounted to -5.9 per cent during the quarter and -29 per cent compared with the previous quarter, when we had a large one-off order. The restructuring process in Norway continued during the quarter, including a smooth handover between the interim CEO and the new permanent CEO, who took up his post in mid-August. We estimate that the effects of the implemented changes and cost reductions will take full effect from the turn of the year, while we in parallel actively address on new segments, particularly data centers.



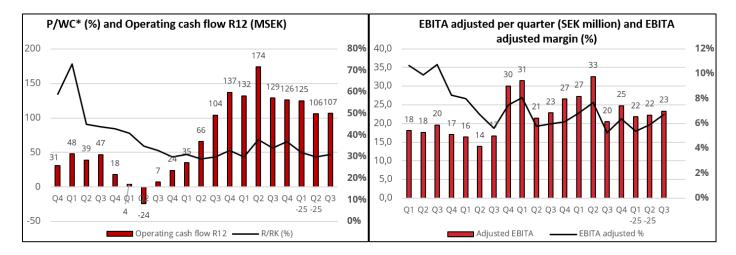

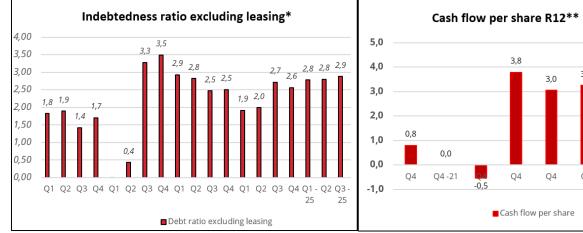
DEVELOPMENT OF THE GROUP'S FINANCIAL TARGETS, CASH FLOW AND SHAREHOLDER **VALUE**

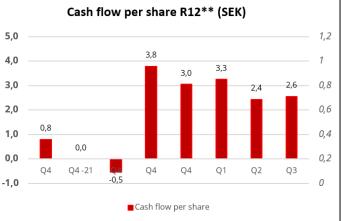
Alcadon Group's long-term financial targets since May 2025 are as follows:

- Profitability Alcadon Group shall reach and maintain a profitability level (P/WC) of 50 per cent
- Profit growth Alcadon Group shall generate an average profit growth of at least 10 per cent per year over time
- **Profit margin** Alcadon Group shall improve profit margin striving for an EBITA margin of 10 per cent
- **Indebtedness** Alcadon Group shall operate with an indebtedness ratio below 3

The historical results for the new financial targets are presented below, together with cash flow per share, in order to increase transparency and focus on these important parameters.



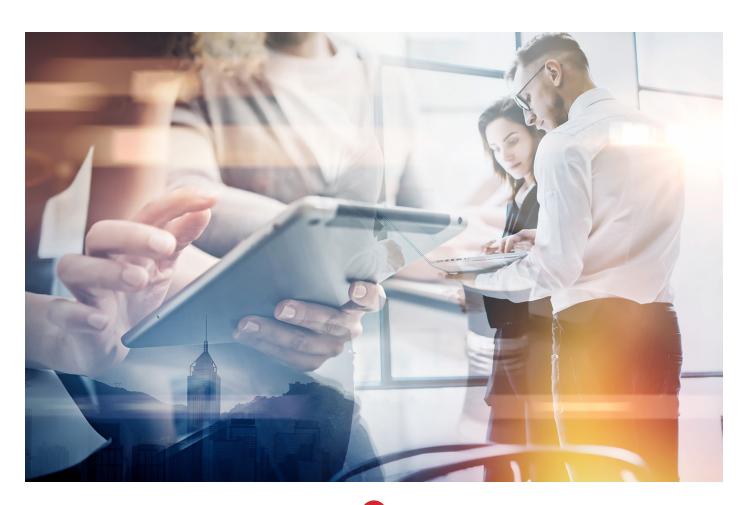

Gross profit:	Net sales minus cost of goods sold.

EBITA margin:	Operating profit before amortisation of intangible assets as a percentage of net sales for the period.
EBITA margin adjusted:	Operating profit before amortisation of intangible assets as a percentage of net sales for the period, adjusted for the reversal of acquisition costs, deductions/reversals of earnings from contingent considerations and unrealised exchange rate gains and losses.
EBIT margin:	Operating profit after depreciation as a percentage of net sales for the period.
Net margin:	Profit for the period as a percentage of net sales.
Return on equity:	Net profit for the last 12 months as a percentage of average equity.
Net interest-bearing liabilities:	Net financial assets including cash and cash equivalents minus interest-bearing provisions and liabilities. The amounts are calculated including lease liabilities in accordance with IFRS 16, amounting to SEK 68 (78) million.

Financial information

REVENUE AND PROFIT

The quarter

Net sales decreased by -11 per cent to SEK 346 (390) million. In unchanged currency, net sales decreased by -9.5 per cent.

The gross margin amounted to 26.8 (24.4) per cent.

Operating expenses amounted to SEK -66 (-71) million. Operating expenses include revaluation of contingent considerations of SEK 0.0 (-1.9) million.

Adjusted operating profit before amortisation of intangible assets (EBITA adjusted) increased by 14 per cent to SEK 23 (20) million. Adjustments of SEK -0.9 (2.5) million relate to SEK 0.3 (0.6) million attributable to unrealised exchange rate gains and losses and SEK -1.2 (1.9) million relating to the revaluation of contingent considerations.

EBITA increased by 35 per cent to SEK 24 (18) million.

Amortisation of acquired customer relationships amounted to SEK -4.5 (-4.4) million.

Profit for the period amounted to SEK 9.2 (5.4) million.

January - September

Net sales decreased by -7.2 per cent to SEK 1,127 (1,215) million. In unchanged currency, net sales decreased by -5.3 per cent. Organic growth including currency effects was -9.7 per cent, excluding currency effects -7.7 per cent, and acquired growth was 2.4 per cent.

The gross margin amounted to 26.0 (25.2) per cent.

Other operating income amounted to SEK 12 million (0.8), of which the reversal of contingent considerations amounted to SEK 3.3 million (0.0) and the revaluation of contingent considerations amounted to SEK -4.5 million (0.0).

Operating expenses amounted to SEK -211 million (-220), of which the acquisition of Wood, which will be consolidated from 2 April 2024, accounted for SEK -15 million (-9.3). Acquisition costs of SEK -2.3 million and exchange rate losses on the revaluation of contingent considerations of SEK -7.2 million were included in 2024.

Adjusted operating profit before amortisation of intangible assets (EBITA adjusted) decreased by -16 per cent to SEK 67 (80) million. Adjustments of SEK -8.5 (11) million relates to SEK -0.7 (1.4) million attributable to unrealised exchange rate gains and losses, SEK -7.8 (7.2) million in revalued and reversed contingent considerations, and acquisition costs of SEK 0.0 (2.3) million.

EBITA increased by 9 per cent to SEK 76 (70) million.

Amortisation of acquired customer relationships amounted to SEK -14 (-12) million.

Profit for the period amounted to SEK 25 (30) million.

CASH FLOW, INVESTMENTS AND LIQUID ASSETS

The quarter

Cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK 16 (14) million. Cash flow from changes in working capital amounted to SEK -5.5 (-8.3) million during the quarter.

Other net investments in tangible, intangible and financial fixed assets amounted to SEK -0.7 (-0.8) million. Net cash flow for acquisitions amounted to SEK -19 (-67) million and consists of the contingent consideration paid for Networks Centre.

Cash flow from financing activities amounted to SEK -12 (12) million, of which SEK -2.5 (-9.7) million is amortisation of bank loans, SEK -4.5 (-6.3) million is interest paid and received, SEK -5.5 (-5.3) million is amortisation of lease liabilities and SEK 0.0 (32) million is changes in overdraft facilities.

January - September

Cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK 66 (87) million. Cash flow from changes in working capital amounted to SEK 13 (14) million during the period.

Other net investments in tangible, intangible and financial fixed assets amounted to SEK -2.8 (-6.1) million. Net cash flow for acquisitions amounted to SEK -19 (-171) million and consists of the contingent considerations paid for Networks Centre. In 2024, this included contingent considerations paid for Networks Centre of SEK -67 million, contingent considerations paid for Alcadon Denmark of SEK -9 million and net cash payment for Wood Communications of SEK -94 million.

Cash flow from financing activities amounted to SEK -62 million (77), of which SEK -12 million (-58) is amortisation of bank loans, SEK -15 million (-19) is interest paid and received, SEK -14 (-13) million is amortisation of lease liabilities and SEK -21 (92) million is change in overdraft facilities. During Q1 2024, financing was raised for the acquisition of Wood Communications, which was completed on 2 April 2024.

At the end of the period, the Group's cash and cash equivalents amounted to SEK 38 (51) million. The overdraft facility granted by SEB amounts to SEK 80 (80) million, of which SEK 80 (48) million was unutilised at the end of the period.

The company has financing from SEB without collateral. The parent company has no contingent liabilities or pledged assets.

OPERATING EXPENSES

The quarter

Operating expenses and cost of goods sold amounted to SEK -319 million (-366), which is a decrease of -13 per cent.

Operating expenses amounted to SEK -66 (-71) million, which is a decrease of -6.9 per cent. Operating expenses include revaluation of contingent considerations of SEK 0.0 (-1.9) million. Adjusted for this, Operating expenses decreased by -4.4 per cent.

January-September

Operating expenses and cost of goods sold amounted to SEK -1,045 million (-1,129), which is a decrease of -7.4 per cent.

Operating expenses amounted to SEK -211 million (-220), which is a decrease of -3.9 per cent. The acquisition of Wood, which is consolidated from 2 April 2024, is included with SEK -15 (-9.3) million, revaluation of contingent considerations with SEK 0.0 (7.2) million and acquisition costs with SEK 0.0 (2.3) million. Adjusted for this, Operating expenses decreased by -2.4 per cent.

PERSONNEL

The number of employees at the end of the period was 190 (190) and the average number of employees during the quarter was 189 (190). During the period, the average number of employees was 187 (181).

EXCHANGE RATE DIFFERENCES

Operating exchange rate differences are reported in accordance with IFRS in operating profit as other operating income/expenses. This includes all exchange rate differences arising from commitments to customers and suppliers. Exchange rate differences attributable to the translation of contingent considerations are also reported in operating profit as other operating income/expenses.

Other exchange rate differences are classified as financial exchange rate differences, which consist of, among other things, exchange rate differences on loans and bank balances in foreign currencies.

Exchange rate differences of an operating nature for the quarter amounted to SEK -0.9 (2.5) million, of which SEK -1.2 (-1.9) million is attributable to the revaluation of contingent considerations.

Unrealised exchange rate differences on internal loans are reported in net financial items and amounted to SEK -2.5 (-0.6) million during the quarter and SEK -9.0 (6.0) million during the period.

Exchange rate differences on foreign operations are reported under other comprehensive income. The exchange rate difference for the quarter amounts to SEK -18.0 (2.4) million and for the period to SEK -61 (30) million. The exchange rate effect is mainly due to changes in the Swedish krona against the GBP, EUR and DKK.

THE PARENT COMPANY

The operations of the parent company, corporate registration number 559009-2382, comprise group management, finance and IR/PR.

Profit after financial items for the quarter amounted to SEK -0.4 (-3.9) million, of which SEK 1.2 (-1.9) million is attributable to translation and reversal of contingent considerations.

Profit after financial items for the period amounted to SEK -1.4 (-20) million, of which SEK 7.8 (-7.2) million is attributable to the recalculation and reversal of contingent considerations.

At the end of the period, cash and cash equivalents amounted to SEK 12 (0.0) million. The approved overdraft facility with SEB amounts to SEK 80 (80) million, of which SEK 80 (48) million was unutilised at the end of the period.

DISPUTES

At the end of the period, the Group had no significant ongoing disputes.

RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The risks and uncertainties applicable to the Alcadon Group are described in the annual report and on the company's website, www.alcadongroup.se.

Any trade barriers in the form of increased customs duties may have a negative effect in the form of higher prices for imported goods. We are monitoring developments closely, but do not currently believe that this will have any significant impact.

No further significant changes have occurred that would necessitate any further changes to these descriptions.

TRANSACTIONS WITH RELATED PARTIES

During the year, the Group, through Alcadon Group AB, had transactions amounting to SEK -0.7 (-0.7) million with Paseca AB, which is owned by the Chairman of the Board, Pierre Fors. The transactions relate to consulting services and work as interim CEO during the period 1 January – 6 January.

Furthermore, Networks Centre has purchased marketing services for SEK -0.3 (-1.3) million from HCO Consulting, which is owned and controlled by Networks Centre's former principal owner Duncan Lindsay, and SEK -0.0 (-0.2) million from X4R Ltd, which is owned and controlled by Networks Centre's CEO James Reid.

All transactions are considered commercial and based on market terms. No other significant transactions with related parties have taken place during the year.

GOODWILL

Goodwill is tested on an ongoing basis to identify any impairment and is reported at acquisition value less accumulated impairment.

The impairment tests carried out at the end of the year showed that there was no need for impairment.

Goodwill amounted to SEK 773 (798) million as of 30 June 2025.

INTEREST EXPENSES

Interest expenses for the quarter amounted to SEK -4.0 (-6.5) million. Of the interest expense, SEK -0.3 (-0.8) million relates to a non-cash discounting effect attributable to contingent considerations for the acquisitions of Networks Centre and Wood, and SEK -0.4 (-0.5) million relates to interest expense on right-of-use assets.

Interest expenses for the period amounted to SEK -14 (-20) million. Of the interest expense, SEK -1.4 (-2.8) million relates to a non-cash discount effect attributable to provisions for contingent considerations for the acquisitions of Networks Centre and Wood, and SEK -1.2 (-1.3) million relates to interest expenses on right-of-use assets.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENT

The Board of Directors of Alcadon has decided on new financial targets for Alcadon Group. The new financial targets will contribute to the Alcadon Group's vision of becoming a leading competence partner in Europe in the digitalisation of society.

NOTE 1. ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES

The consolidated accounts have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) and IFRS Interpretations Committee interpretations as adopted by the EU. Furthermore, the recommendation from the Swedish Financial Reporting Board, RFR 1, regarding supplementary accounting rules for groups has been applied.

This interim report has been prepared for the Group in accordance with the Swedish Annual Accounts Act (ÅRL) and IAS 34 Interim Financial Reporting, and for the parent company in accordance with the Swedish Annual Accounts Act and the Swedish Financial Reporting Board's recommendation RFR 2, Accounting for Legal Entities.

The same accounting principles and calculation methods have been applied for the Group and the parent company as in the most recent annual report, except for new standards and interpretations and changes to existing standards and interpretations that apply from 1 January 2025 or later.

IFRS 16 Leases

Alcadon applies IFRS 16 Leases.

As Alcadon is the lessee, the right-of-use assets are reported as a right of use in the statement of financial position, while the future obligation to the lessor is reported as a liability in the statement of financial position. The Group leases office and warehouse premises and cars. Short-term leases and leases of low-value assets are not included as these are expensed directly.

Closing values in the balance sheet as of 30 September 2025:

- Right-of-use assets: SEK 67 (82) million, reported in Tangible fixed assets
- Lease liabilities: SEK 64 (79) million, reported separately as SEK 45 (57) million in Other long-term liabilities and SEK 19 (22) million in other interest-bearing liabilities

Other

IFRS 18 Presentation and disclosure in financial statements applicable for financial years beginning on 1 January 2027 or later. The standard will replace IAS 1 Presentation of Financial Statements and introduce new requirements that will contribute to achieving comparability in the reporting of results for similar companies and provide users with more relevant information and transparency. IFRS 18 will not affect the recognition or measurement of items in the financial statements, i.e. it will have no effect on net profit. Management will begin evaluating the consequences of applying the new standard in 2025.

None of the other IFRS or IFRIC interpretations that have not yet come into force are expected to have any material impact on the Group's financial statements. NOTE 2. NET SALES

Alcadon is primarily engaged in the sale of goods, which accounts for more than 99 per cent of net sales. Net sales are made in various regions and revenue from sales is recognised in the income statement when control has been transferred to the customer. The Group also provides services in the form of technical support and service agreements. Technical support is considered to constitute separate performance obligations where revenue is recognised over time. Service agreements are recognised on a straight-line basis over the term of the agreement. See the table below for net sales per region.

The contingent consideration for the acquisition of Networks Centre of SEK 19 million (GBP 1.5 million) relates to the discounted value of the remaining contingent considerations of GBP 1.5 million, corresponding to SEK 19 million calculated at the closing date.

The contingent considerations for the acquisition of Wood Communications of SEK 24 million (EUR 2.0 million) refers to the discounted value of the remaining contingent considerations of EUR 2.2 million. This corresponds to SEK 25 million calculated at the closing date. The total possible remaining contingent considerations amounts to EUR 2.3 million, corresponding to SEK 26 million calculated at the closing date.

The difference between the discounted values in the balance sheet and the remaining recognised contingent considerations (0.0 MGBP and 0.2 MEUR) is recognised as an interest expense in net financial items until the date of payment of contingent considerations. Interest expense for the quarter amounted to SEK -0.3 (-0.8) million and for the period to SEK -1.4 (-2.8) million.

During the third quarter, SEK 19 million (GBP 1.5 million) was paid out of the final contingent consideration for Networks Centre. The remaining contingent consideration of SEK 19 million (GBP 1.5 million) was paid out at the beginning of the fourth quarter.
