The period in brief

Third quarter July-September 2025

- Net sales amounted to MSEK 20.4 (18.4), an increase of 10.8 %.
- EBITDA amounted to MSEK -17.7 (-10.2), while EBITDA adjusted for results from shares in associated companies amounted to MSEK -15.3 (-6.7).
- EBIT amounted to MSEK -19.3 (-12.0), whereas EBIT adjusted for results from shares in associated companies amounted to MSEK -16.9 (-8.5).
- The result for the period amounted to MSEK -19.1 (-11.9).
- Earnings per share before and after dilution was neg. (neg.).
- Cash flow for the period amounted to MSEK -6.2 (-12.1).
- The Group's cash and cash equivalents amounted to MSEK 28.0 (54.7).

January-September 2025

- EBIT amounted to MSEK -35.6 (-41.2), whereas EBIT adjusted for results from shares in associated companies amounted to MSEK -26.6 (-29.8).
- The result for the period amounted to MSEK -36.0 (-39.9).
- Earnings per share before and after dilution was neg. (neg.).
- Cash flow for the period amounted to MSEK -11.8 (-34.9).

Significant events during the period

- Gapwaves commenced production for Valeo at its facility in Gothenburg.
- Gapwaves initiated a collaboration with Infineon Technologies, a globally leading German semiconductor company.

Significant events after the end of the period

- Gapwaves board of directors has resolved on a fully underwritten rights issue of approx MSEK 78, conditional on the approval of general meeting and enters into a loan facility agreement of MSEK 15.
- Director Martin Kornacker announced that he intends to withdraw from the board of directors
- · Gapwaves will hold an Extraordinary General Meeting on October 31st.
- · Nils Mösko has been appointed CFO.

Industrial scale-up

Revenue amounted to MSEK 20.4, an increase of 11% compared to the same period last year. The result reflects that we are in the initial phase of production for Valeo and are accelerating the volume ramp-up, driven by strong demand. This is a further proof point of Gapwaves being a strategically valuable partner and supplier for unique antenna solutions. The momentum continues with customer dialogues around new applications, such as in-cabin radar.

More deliveries and increased volumes

The third quarter of 2025 was characterised by a clear focus on ramping up production for our customers. To date, over 500,000 antennas have been manufactured using Gapwaves technology since the company was founded. Deliveries are proceeding according to plan, confirming that both the technology and production are functioning at industrial scale. During the quarter, volumes to Valeo have steadily increased since production began this summer. At the same time, production of the antenna for HELLA's Gen 6 radar sensor continues to grow. A key focus right now is preparing for serial production in China next year. Our global and flexible production model provides assurance to customers seeking to secure local delivery capacity.

Underlying growth drivers remain, despite uncertainty

New enquiries continue to come in, even though major uncertainties in the global environment and automotive industry persist, leading several car manufacturers and Tier 1 suppliers to remain cautious. However, the long-term trends - growing demand for improved vehicle safety, stricter legal requirements,

and technical regulations - remain intact.

To meet these demands, better and significantly more radar sensors per vehicle are needed, which is driving demand for our gap waveguide technology.

Gapwaves now on the roads!

A very positive milestone we were able to announce is that Gapwaves' waveguide antenna technology is now implemented and available in the brand-new Mercedes-Benz CLA, which began hitting Swedish roads during the quarter. The antenna was developed for HELLA's new radar sensor. Seeing this innovation become reality, in vehicles on our roads, is a major milestone for Gapwaves.

Continued growth in Sensrad

Our associated company Sensrad also experienced revenue growth during the quarter, with particularly strong interest in autonomous solutions for military applications. Discussions with several potential customers are ongoing.

Funding for scaling up

To secure our further growth - we are conducting a financing round. The funding will be used to:

- » Accelerate commercial expansion by realising identified business opportunities, strengthening existing customer relationships, and establishing new strategic partnerships in selected markets.
- » Scale up production and supply chain capacity to meet rapidly growing demand and ensure readiness for both current and future projects.
- » Broaden the customer base across automotive, industrial, telecom, and transport sectors and applications, while continuing to support Sensrad's commercial scale-up.
- » Invest in next-generation technologies and profitability-driven initiatives to reinforce long-term competitiveness.

In summary, our strategy remains firm. We see continued market potential and are confident that our unique waveguide technology will play a decisive role in the future of radar sensors - thanks to our customers, partners, and employees.

World-leading, patented technology and unique Know-how

Gapwaves' technology, backed by over 40 patents, enables cost-effective, compact, and high-performance antenna solutions. This is crucial for advanced radar systems where performance and cost-efficiency are paramount.

Strong demand driven by increased security requirements and new features

Tighter security standards and new functionalities are driving demand for radar sensors, making Gapwaves' antenna technology essential. This includes requirements in advanced driver-assistance systems (ADAS) in vehicles and traffic management in smart cities.

Testing and production of customer-funded prototypes and small batch volumes are handled at Gapwaves' own pilot line, while large-scale production is managed by selected partners. This setup offers flexibility and scalability, customized production, and low capital requirements compared to owning manufacturing facilities.

Market overview

Radar

Trends and drivers

The development of automotive radar is driven by stricter safety requirements, new legislation, and increased automation - all factors that raise both the number of sensors per vehicle and performance demands. In both the EU and the US, regulations are tightening. For example, Europe is mandating automatic emergency braking systems (AEB), while the US is introducing new pedestrian protection guidelines through US NCAP and FMVSS 127. These raise performance standards, especially for nighttime and high-speed conditions. The focus is on higher resolution, longer range, and the transition to higher frequencies (76-81 GHz), where waveguide antennas offer superior performance. Although still a niche technology, waveguide antennas are expected to gain market share as volume production scales up and requirements in advanced ADAS and autonomous driving systems increase, with full automation requiring 7-11 radars per vehicle.

Focus segments

Automotive

Gapwaves' primary focus is the passenger vehicle industry, where radar sensors are crucial for ADAS. As safety regulations and autonomous functions increase, so does the number of radar sensors per

vehicle and the demand for efficient antenna solutions. An average passenger vehicle is expected to be equipped with at least 3 radar sensors. Gapwaves works with several leading global Tier-1 suppliers in Europe, the US, and Asia, including Valeo, Hella, Magna, and Desay SV.

Smart cities

Radar is on the way to play an important role in smart cities, where the need for optimized and monitored traffic flows is growing. High-performance radar sensors are used to monitor traffic and distinguish between vehicles, pedestrians, cyclists, and more. Meeting the performance requirements calls for waveguide antennas, which help radar sensors provide a clearer picture of traffic conditions.

Mobility

Radar sensors are used in industrial and passenger transport, from mining to buses, trains, and aircraft, enabling autonomous vehicles like self-driving trucks and robotaxis. Radar's superior performance in poor weather and lighting, compared to lidar and cameras, is vital for safe, efficient future transport systems. These sensors need high-performance waveguide antennas.

Wireless communication

Trends and drivers

Increased demand for bandwidth is driving developments in wireless communication, requiring technologies capable of handling higher frequencies. In the telecom sector, 5G is central, with demands for low latency and high data speeds to support connected cities, IoT, and autonomous vehicles, placing high demands on antenna technology. In satellite communications (satcom), the need for high-performance waveguide-based antennas is growing in line with the next generation of satellites. In both segments, the combination of high performance and cost efficiency is critical.



Focus segments

Telecom

Smart cities, IoT, and autonomous vehicles require fast communication and high data throughput, especially in areas with many connected devices, such as airports and office buildings. This increases the need for higher frequencies (24–100 GHz and beyond), where traditional antennas fall short, while Gapwaves' technology delivers superior performance. It is also used in Fixed Wireless Access (FWA) systems for wireless broadband that can replace fiber connections.

Satcom

Satellite communication is rapidly expanding with LEO and MEO satellites that offer global coverage and high data transmission. Advanced antenna technology is required to handle high frequencies and ensure reliable communication, driven by the growing need for bandwidth to support IoT, global connectivity, and fast data transfer — particularly in remote areas.

Financial overview

Quarter: July-September 2025

Revenue

The Group's net sales for the third quarter totalled MSEK 20.4 (18.4), representing a increase of 10.8% compared to the same quarter previous year. Net sales was primarily driven by the sale of production equipment to Frencken Group, amounting to approximately MSEK 9.1, and product sales to Valeo. Project and prototype revenues from Hella, Valeo, and Infineon contributed a smaller portion.

In addition to sales revenue, the Group recognised research grants of MSEK 0.9 (0.1), foreign exchange gains of MSEK 0.1 (0.2), and invoiced costs to Sensrad AB and Qamcom Research and Technology AB totalling MSEK 0.6 (0.5). These items are reported under other operating income.



EBITDA and operating result

The Group's Earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation and amortization (EBITDA) decreased during the quarter compared to the previous year, totalling MSEK -17.7 (-10.2). The decrease is primarily due to higher costs associated with the production ramp-up and slightly increased operating expenses, partially offset by higher revenue. Operating expenses excluding depreciation and results from shares in associated companies amounted to MSEK -37.1 (-26.0). The increase compared to the same quarter last year is mainly attributable to a larger share of revenue coming from product sales and sales of production equipment, as well as certain start-up costs related to the start of production.

Personnel costs include non-cash items such as a higher bonus provision of MSEK -1.6 and LTI 2022 costs totalling MSEK -0.8 (-0.5). EBITDA includes results from shares in associated companies of MSEK -2.4 (-3.5), primarily driven by goodwill amortisation of MSEK -1.1 (-1.1) and the Group's share of the associated company's result of MSEK -1.3 (-2.2). Adjusted for this, EBITDA for the quarter amounts to MSEK -15.3 (-6.7). The operating result for the quarter amounted to MSEK -19.3 (-12.0), and MSEK -16.9 (-8.5) when adjusted for results from shares in associated companies.

Result for the period

Net financial items totalled MSEK 0.2 (0.1), mainly attributable to interest income of MSEK 0.3 (0.4), interest expenses of MSEK -0.1 (-0.1), and exchange rate differences of MSEK 0.0 (-0.2). The result for the period during the quarter amounted to MSEK -19.1 (-11.9).

Financial position and liquidity

Total assets as of 30 September 2025 amounted to MSEK 100.7 (138.3). Equity totalled MSEK 67.6 (114.5), and cash and cash equivalents was MSEK 28.0 (54.7). Gapwaves has no financial debt other than lease liabilities.

Gapwaves board of directors has resolved on a fully underwritten rights issue of approximately MSEK 78, conditional on the approval of the general meeting and enters into a loan facility agreement of MSEK 15

Management and the Board assess that the company's liquidity and capital position remain stable, providing a solid foundation for growth in line with the established strategy and continued support for the commercial scale-up of Sensrad.

Cash flow and investments

Cash flow from operating activities was negative during the quarter, amounting to MSEK -5.1 (-9.2). The cash flow was impacted by working capital as production has now commenced. Cash flow from investing activities totalled MSEK -1.1 (-2.9), primarily relating to long-term loans to Sensrad AB. Cash flow for the period amounted to MSEK -6.2 (-12.1).

Financial overview

Period: January-September 2025

Revenue

The Group's net sales during the period amounted to MSEK 67.2 (48.5), which corresponds to an increase of 38.7% compared to the same period last year. Net sales was primarily attributable to project and prototype related revenue from Hella, Valeo, and product sales to Valeo. During the period, the Group also had revenue related to the sale of production equipment to Frencken Group of approximately MSEK 21.4. In addition to sales revenues, research grants for approximately MSEK 3.2 (0.8) were recognized, along with currency exchange gains of MSEK 0.8 (0.4) and invoiced costs to Sensrad AB and Qamcom Research and Technology AB totaling MSEK 1.6 (1.9). These items are reported under other operating income.

EBITDA and operating result

The Group's Earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation and amortization (EBITDA) was strengthened during the period compared to last year and amounted to MSEK -30.6 (-35.7). The improvement in EBITDA during the quarter is mainly explained by higher revenue. Operating expenses excluding depreciation and results from shares in associated companies amounted to MSEK -94.6 (-75.9).

Operating expenses have increased compared to the same period last year, mainly due to higher costs for goods related to a higher proportion of revenue coming from product sales and sales of production equipment, as well as unfavorable currency effects. Personnel costs include non-cash items such as costs for LTI 2022 totaling MSEK -1.5 (-1.4)

EBITDA includes results from shares in associated companies of MSEK -9.0 (-11.4), which is related to goodwill amortization of MSEK -3.2 (-3.2) and the Group's share of the associated company's result of MSEK -5.3 (-8.3). Adjusted for this, EBITDA amounted to MSEK -21.7 (-24.3) during the period. The operating result during the period amounted to MSEK -35.6 (-41.2) and MSEK -26.6 (-29.8) when adjusting for results from shares in associated companies.

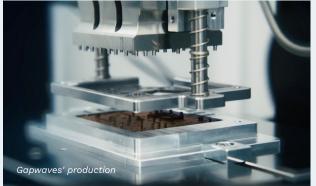
Result for the period

Net financial items amounted to MSEK -0.4 (1.3), which is mainly related to interest income of MSEK 0.9 (1.2), interest expenses of MSEK -0.3 (-0.1) and exchange rate differences of MSEK -1.0 (0.2). The result for the period during the period amounted to MSEK -36.0 (-39.9).

Cash flow and investments

Cash flow from operating activities improved during the period and amounted to MSEK -6.8 (-16.3) due to improvements in working capital. Cash flow from investing activities amounted to MSEK -4.9 (-18.7) and are mainly related to long-term loans to Sensrad AB. Cash flow for the period amounted to MSEK -11.8 (-34.9).

Other disclosures



Accounting policies

The company applies the Swedish Annual Accounts Act and the Swedish Accounting Standards Board's general advice BFNAR 2012:1 Annual reports and consolidated financial statements (K3). All balance sheet items are also measured at historical cost in accordance with Chapter 11 of K3.

Risks and uncertainties

Gapwaves is exposed to risks and uncertainties through its operations. For more detailed information on the main operational and financial risks, please refer to page 34 of the 2024 annual report.

Seasonal variations

Over the next few years, the company's sales are expected to largely comprise development projects that reflect customer needs and product development cycles. This is expected to create a certain level of volatility in sales between quarters.

Organization

The number of permanent employees in the Group as per September 30, 2025 was 43 (40).

ESG activities

We established our sustainability initiative in 2023, where we defined frameworks and strategies. We have continued our work by implementing additional measures during the quarter. We continue to validate and update our efforts as needed to ensure that we continue to make progress towards our sustainability goals.

Related party transactions

The company did not have any transactions with related parties during the third quarter of 2025.

Share and shareholders

Share

Gapwaves' B share has been listed on Nasdaq First North Growth Market Stockholm since November 18, 2016, and trading takes place under the ticker GAPWB. As of September 30, 2025, the company had approximately 6,000 shareholders. The company has a total of 31,146,299 shares, of which 7,617,500 are A shares and 23,528,799 are B shares. Each A share entitles the holder to ten votes and each B share entitles the holder to one vote. As of September 30, 2025, the share capital was SEK 1,868,778 which represents a quotient value of SEK 0.06 per share.

Warrants: Series 2022/2025

At the Extraordinary General Meeting on June 10, 2022, the shareholders decided to issue a warrant program (Series 2022/2025) for all permanent employees (540,000 warrants) and the Board of Directors (100,000 warrants), a total of 640,000 warrants. The warrants may be exercised for subscription of B shares in the company during the period between June 9, 2025 and August 29, 2025. A total of 502,541 warrants were subscribed for at a subscription price of SEK 38.20. The price per warrant was set at SEK 7.18 through an external Share and shareholders valuation. The total dilutive effect on full exercise was expected to be approximately 2.3% of the outstanding capital and 0.65% of the outstanding votes. The share price did not reach the exercise price, and the warrants have therefore expired without conversion.

LTI 2022

At the Extraordinary General Meeting on August 19, 2022, the shareholders resolved to approve the Board's proposal to issue a long-term incentive program for senior executives and other key individuals in the Group. The aim of the program is to strengthen the Group's ability to recruit and retain key individuals. LTI 2022 comprises a maximum of 13 key individuals in the Group. The maximum number of performance share rights that can be allocated in accordance with LTI 2022 is to be limited to 642,595. Per 30 September 2025, the program has 4 participants with the possibility to earn a maximum of 314,712 performance stock rights. During the third quarter, an expense of MSEK -0.8 (-0.5), including a cost of -0,4 MSEK (-0,1) in employer contributions, has been accrued for LTI

2022. For the period January-September, a cost of MSEK -1.5 (-1.4), including a cost of MSEK -0.5 (-0.3) in employer contributions, has been accrued for LTI 2022.
