



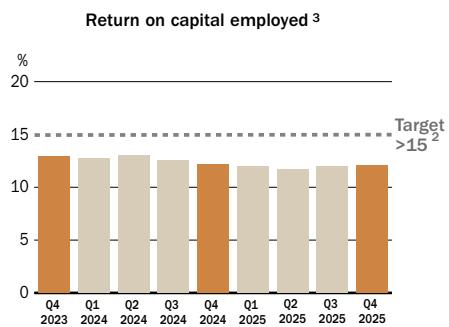
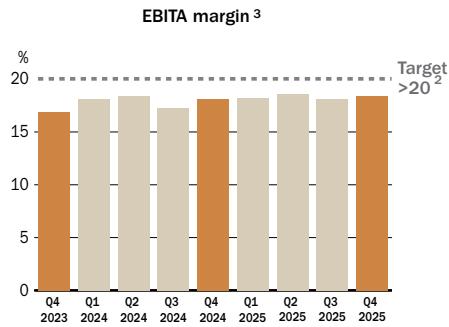
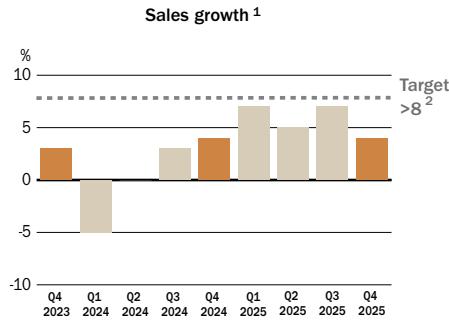

Fourth quarter 2025 – Continued margin improvements

- Net sales for the quarter declined by 5 percent to SEK 8,380 M (8,783). Organic sales increased by 1 percent compared with the preceding year, structural changes increased sales by 3 percent while translation of currency reduced sales by 9 percent compared with the preceding year.
- EBITA, excluding items affecting comparability, decreased by 3 percent to SEK 1,542 M (1,587). The exchange rate effect from the translation of foreign subsidiaries had a negative impact of SEK 140 M. The EBITA margin was 18.4 percent (18.1). This was the highest margin for a fourth quarter ever.
- Items affecting comparability for the quarter totaled SEK -176 M (-76) and pertained to restructuring costs of SEK -222 M (-76) and a positive effect of SEK 46 M attributable to the revaluation of an additional purchase payment recorded as a liability.
- EBITA, including items affecting comparability, amounted to SEK 1,366 M (1,511) for the quarter.
- Earnings per share, excluding items affecting comparability, amounted to SEK 4.30 (4.24), up 1 percent. The exchange rate effect from translation of foreign subsidiaries had a negative impact on earnings per share of SEK 0.38.
- The Board of Directors proposes a cash dividend of SEK 8.00 per share (7.50).
- For the Group as a whole, earnings per share were SEK 3.71 (3.99).
- Operating cash flow amounted to SEK 1,726 M (1,681), up 3 percent.
- The cash conversion ratio for the most recent 12-month period was 93 percent (89).

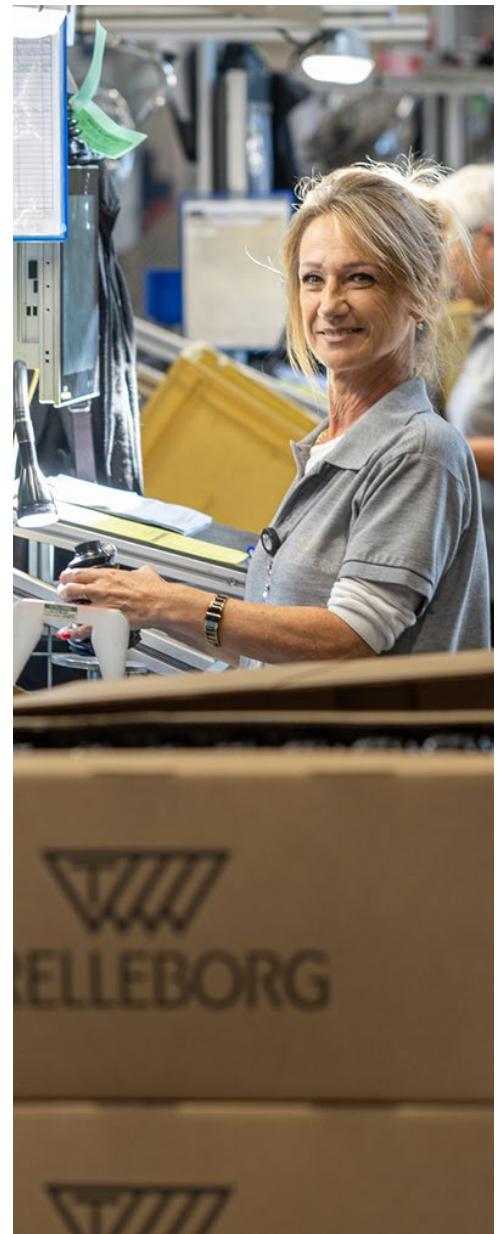

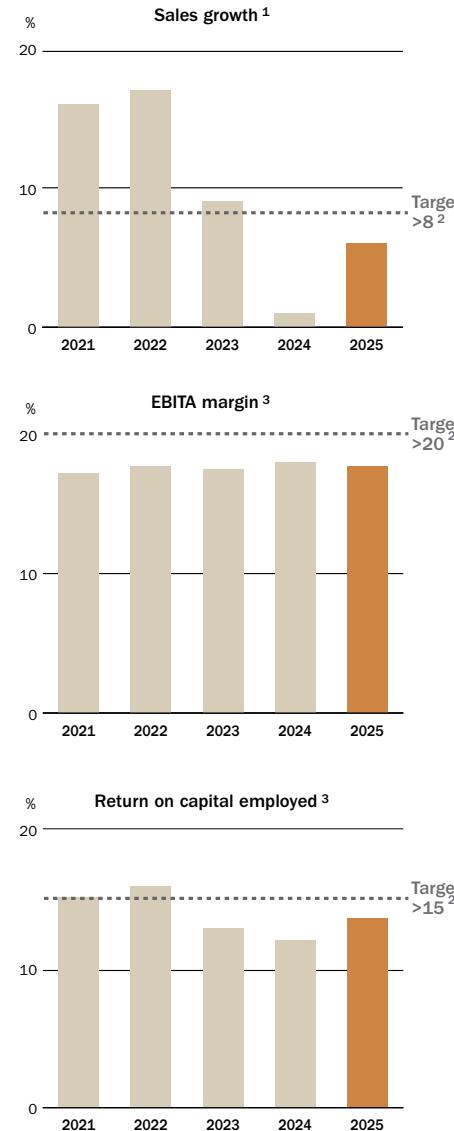

Full year 2025

- Net sales for full year 2025 were on par with the preceding year at SEK 34,329 M (34,170). Organic sales increased by 1 percent compared with the preceding year, structural changes increased sales by 5 percent while translation of currency reduced sales by 6 percent compared with the preceding year.
- EBITA, excluding items affecting comparability, increased by 2 percent to SEK 6,286 M (6,140). The exchange rate effect from the translation of foreign subsidiaries had a negative impact of SEK 329 M for a full year.
- Items affecting comparability totaled SEK -389 M (-315) and pertained to restructuring costs of SEK -435 M (-315) and a positive effect of SEK 46 M attributable to the revaluation of an additional purchase payment recorded as a liability.
- EBITA, including items affecting comparability, amounted to SEK 5,897 M (5,825).
- Earnings per share, excluding items affecting comparability, amounted to SEK 17.09 (16.74), up 2 percent.
- For the Group as a whole, earnings per share were SEK 15.76 (15.73).
- Operating cash flow amounted to SEK 5,288 M (5,011), up 6 percent.
- The cash conversion ratio for the most recent 12-month period was 93 percent (89).

Continued margin improvement

Trelleborg ended 2025 with a stable fourth quarter. The Group reported positive organic sales growth despite continued volatile market conditions and declining volumes in several market segments. Organic sales increased 1 percent compared with the preceding year. Acquisitions contributed 3 percent, while currency translation had a negative impact of 9 percent.

EBITA, excluding items affecting comparability, declined 3 percent, fully attributable to negative exchange rate effects of SEK 140 M from the translation of foreign subsidiaries. The EBITA margin amounted to 18.4 percent (18.1), the highest ever for a fourth quarter. Operating cash flow strengthened, increasing by 3 percent.

In view of the Group's strong financial position and stable earnings, the Board of Directors proposes a dividend of SEK 8.00 per share (7.50).

Sustainability is an integral part of our long-term value-creation strategy. The share of renewable and fossil-free electricity increased to 98 percent (88) during the year, proving that our initiatives are generating the desired effect.

Trelleborg is continuing its strategic development journey toward becoming a more stable and less cyclical business. The Group has gradually enhanced its business model by consistently focusing on advanced, value-creating solutions in selected applications and market segments. Our profitability has improved and performed in line with our long-term ambitions, despite challenging market conditions at times throughout the year.

Our already robust market positions were further strengthened during the year with the addition of six carefully selected acquisitions. At the beginning of 2026, we also acquired Nexus Elastomer Molds, a specialist in customized tooling solutions and automated manufacturing cells.

In 2025, the Group invested significantly to expand its footprint in priority geographies and market segments. New production facilities were inaugurated in Costa Rica and Vietnam, while existing facilities in the US and Malta were expanded. We will continue to invest in new plants in India, the US and Morocco in 2026.

Combined, this provides a solid platform for continued long-term value creation and improved operational efficiency.

Trelleborg Industrial Solutions reported lower organic sales for the quarter compared with the corresponding period of the preceding year. The primary reason for the decline is a temporary reduction in deliveries in large-scale marine projects and in LNG transfer solutions. Demand in parts of the construction sector remained weak, while the performance in industrial market segments varied across applications. Sales to the automotive industry were stable and deliveries to the aerospace industry increased. A further improvement was noted for the operating margin, fueled by a continued focus on attractive segments and completed structural improvements.

Trelleborg Medical Solutions reported a clear improvement in organic sales compared with the corresponding period of the preceding year. Sales of polymer solutions to the medtech market performed positively in Europe and Asia, while the North American market remained sluggish. Deliveries to the smaller life science segment noted strong global growth. The operating margin strengthened, primarily due to higher volumes. The new state-of-the-art facility in Costa Rica was inaugurated at the end of the quarter.

Trelleborg Sealing Solutions reported a clear increase in organic sales compared with the corresponding period of the preceding year. Sales to the industrials segment increased in all geographic markets. Deliveries to the automotive industry decreased, mainly in Europe, and were also sluggish in other markets. The aerospace industry continued to demonstrate strong global sales growth. The operating margin improved despite a negative impact from the sales mix and acquisitions with initially lower profitability.

The Group is financially strong and has a robust balance sheet that provides scope for continued value-creating acquisitions, selective investments in current operations and further share buybacks. Despite the continued uncertainty and some volatility dominating the external environment, our general assessment is that demand in the first quarter will be on a par with trend in the fourth quarter.

Net sales and result

FOURTH QUARTER 2025

Net sales

Net sales for the fourth quarter of 2025 amounted to SEK 8,380 M (8,783), a decrease of 5 percent. Organic sales increased by 1 percent compared with the preceding year, structural changes increased sales by 3 percent while translation of currency reduced sales by 9 percent.

Sales per market

Compared with the previous year, organic sales in Europe increased by 4 percent. In North and South America, organic sales increased by 3 percent. Organic sales in Asia and Other markets decreased by 4 percent.

EBITA, excluding items affecting comparability

EBITA amounted to SEK 1,542 M (1,587), a decrease of 3 percent. The EBITA margin was 18.4 percent (18.1). This was the highest margin for a fourth quarter ever.

The exchange rate effect from translation of foreign subsidiaries on EBITA, excluding items affecting comparability, had a negative effect of SEK 140 M on earnings compared with the year-earlier period.

Items affecting comparability for the quarter totaled SEK -176 M (-76) and pertained to restructuring costs of SEK -222 M (-76) and a positive effect of SEK 46 M attributable to the revaluation of an additional purchase payment recorded as a liability. Including items affecting comparability, EBITA for the quarter amounted to SEK 1,366 M (1,511).

EBIT

EBIT, including items affecting comparability, amounted to SEK 1,223 M (1,344), a decrease of 9 percent. The exchange rate effect from translation of foreign subsidiaries on EBIT, including items affecting comparability, had a negative effect of SEK 114 M on earnings compared with the year-earlier period.

Financial income and expenses

Financial income and expenses amounted to SEK -111 M (-86).

Net profit

Net profit was SEK 836 M (932). The tax rate for the quarter was 25 percent (26). The underlying tax rate is expected to continue to amount to 25 percent on a full year basis.

Earnings per share

Earnings per share, excluding items affecting comparability, amounted to SEK 4.30 (4.24). The exchange rate effect from translation of foreign subsidiaries had a negative impact on earnings per share of SEK 0.38. For the Group as a whole, earnings per share were SEK 3.71 (3.99).

FULL YEAR 2025

Net sales for full year 2025 amounted to SEK 34,329 M (34,170), on a par with the preceding year. Organic sales increased by 1 percent year-on-year.

EBITA, excluding items affecting comparability, amounted to SEK 6,286 M (6,140), corresponding to an EBITA margin of 18.3 percent (18.0). Earnings and the margin were the highest to date for a full year.

The exchange rate effect from translation of foreign subsidiaries on EBITA, excluding items affecting comparability, had a negative effect of SEK 329 M on earnings compared with the year-earlier period.

Items affecting comparability totaled SEK -389 M (-315) and pertained to restructuring costs of SEK -435 M (-315) and a positive effect of SEK 46 M attributable to the revaluation of an additional purchase payment recorded as a liability.

EBITA, including items affecting comparability, amounted to SEK 5,897 M (5,825).

EBIT, including items affecting comparability, amounted to SEK 5,317 M (5,287), an increase of 1 percent.

Financial income and expenses amounted to a net of SEK -506 M (-297). The comparison figure for the preceding year included interest income of SEK 155 M relating to the Group's net cash position up until mid-July 2024. The higher level of net debt has resulted in increased interest expenses compared with the year-earlier period.

Profit before tax totaled SEK 4,811 M (4,990). The tax rate was 25 percent (25). Net profit for the Group amounted to SEK 3,596 M (3,736).

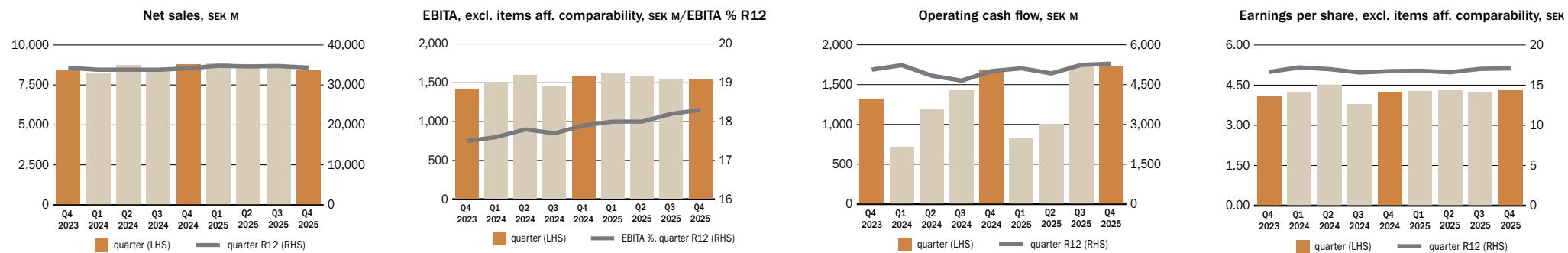

Capital employed

Capital employed decreased year-on-year and amounted to SEK 44,972 M (49,381) at the end of the quarter, with the difference primarily attributable to exchange rate effects from the translation of foreign subsidiaries. Return on capital employed for the most recent 12-month period, excluding items affecting comparability, was 12.1 percent (12.2). Return on capital employed, including items affecting comparability, for the corresponding period was 11.3 percent (11.6).

Shareholders' equity

Shareholders' equity at the close of the period amounted to SEK 36,499 M (41,569), impacted negatively by translation differences, dividends to the shareholders of the Parent Company and the repurchase of own shares, and impacted positively by net profit for the year.

In 2025, 7,043,701 Series B shares in Trelleborg (of which 1,336,224 in the fourth quarter), corresponding to SEK 2,658 M, were repurchased. This corresponds to 3.0 percent of the shares outstanding, which amounted to 231,328,373 on the balance sheet date. In accordance with the resolution at the Annual General Meeting on April 24, 2025, Trelleborg has canceled 10,218,813 own shares of Series B, of which 9,094,230 were repurchased during 2024 and 1,124,583 during 2025. The number of treasury shares amounted to 5,919,118 (9,094,230) on the balance sheet date.

Equity per share amounted to SEK 162 (179), based on the number of outstanding shares less treasury shares on the balance sheet date (225,409,255 shares). The equity/assets ratio was 66 percent (69). The return on shareholders' equity for the most recent 12-month period, excluding items affecting comparability, amounted to 10.0 percent (9.6). The return on shareholders' equity for the Group, including items affecting comparability, amounted to 9.2 percent (9.0) for the corresponding period.

The Board of Directors proposes a cash dividend of SEK 8.00 per share (7.50).



Cash flow and net debt

Operating cash flow

Operating cash flow for the quarter amounted to SEK 1,726 M (1,681), up 3 percent. Lower capital expenditure compared with the year-earlier period had a positive impact on cash flow. The cash conversion ratio for the most recent 12-month period was 93 percent (89).

Free cash flow

Free cash flow at the end of the quarter amounted to SEK 3,351 M (2,917). Net cash flow amounted to SEK -2,338 M (-8,323). Net cash flow for the period was impacted by the effects from acquisitions of SEK -1,312 M (-5,496), dividends to the shareholders of the Parent Company of SEK -1,719 M (-1,617) as well as the repurchase of own shares of SEK -2,658 M (-4,127).

Net debt

Net debt at the end of the quarter amounted to SEK -7,216 M (-6,735) and was impacted by net cash flow for the period of SEK -2,338 M (-8,323), positive exchange rate differences on net debt in local currencies of SEK 1,675 M (-959) and non-cash adjustments of lease and pension liabilities totaling SEK 136 M (-135) and SEK 46 M attributable to the revaluation of an additional purchase payment recorded as a liability.

The debt/equity ratio was 20 percent (16). Net debt in relation to EBITDA was 1.0 (0.9).

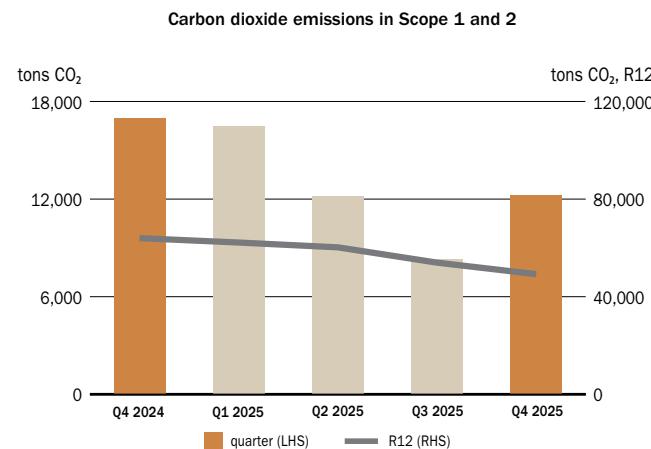

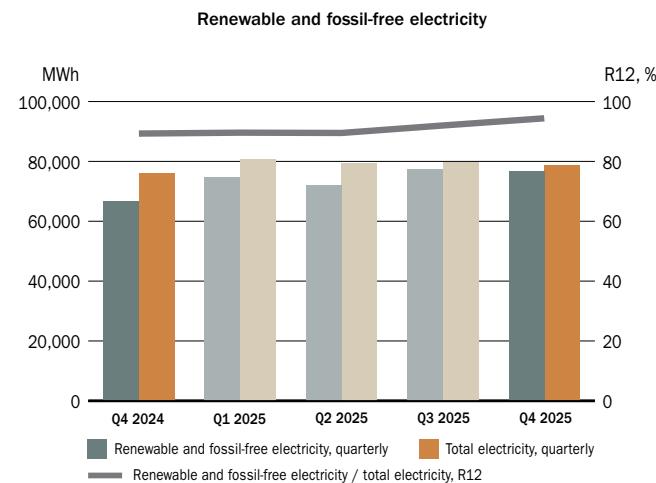
Lower climate impact

Scope 1 and 2 carbon dioxide emissions for the quarter declined by 28 percent compared with the year-earlier period to 12,219 metric tons (16,953). This positive trend was driven by the purchase of renewable electricity and increased energy efficiency based on the Group's Energy Excellence program. The proportion of renewable and fossil-free electricity in the quarter increased to 98 percent (88) compared with the year-earlier period.



Social engagement

Trelleborg actively participates in the local communities where the Group operates. The focus is on promoting education, physical activity among children and young people as well as local environmental projects. Examples of local engagement include Trelleborg's support for the GNR8 Academy in Leicester, where a multi-year partnership means that it is possible to offer after-school and holiday sports activities for children from disadvantaged areas. In South Korea, our semiconductor seals facility started a partnership with a nearby elementary school. Employees here participate in activities to improve the school environment and thus create a more inspiring and safe learning environment for the pupils.

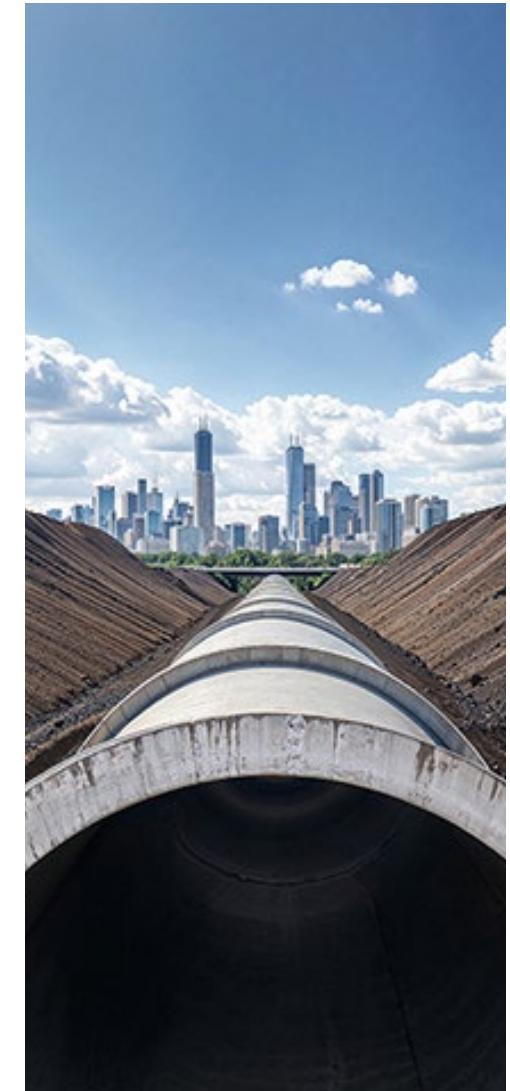
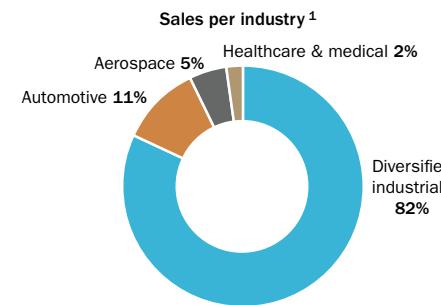
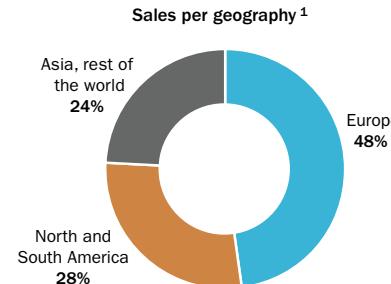
Organic sales for the quarter declined 3 percent year-on-year. Acquisitions supported a sales increase of 4 percent. While organic sales increased in Europe, a decrease was noted in North America and Asia. Sales to the marine and energy segments decreased due to temporarily fewer projects deliveries. Sales to certain segments in the construction industry remained challenging. Deliveries to industrial market segments noted a varying sales trend. Sales to the automotive industry were stable, while deliveries to the aerospace industry increased.

EBITA decreased as a result of lower sales and negative exchange rate effects compared with the year-earlier period, while the EBITA margin increased, mainly due to structural improvements and the sales mix. Exchange rate effects from the translation of foreign subsidiaries had a negative impact of SEK 54 M on EBITA compared with the year-earlier quarter.

FULL YEAR 2025

Organic sales for the full year were unchanged compared with the preceding year. Acquisitions supported a sales increase of 4 percent. The sales trend was positive in Asia, stable in North America, but slightly weaker in Europe. Deliveries to major projects performed well for most of the year. Deliveries to certain segments in the construction industry were challenging for the entire period. Other market segments reported varied organic sales growth.

EBITA and the EBITA margin increased slightly year-on-year, as a result of structural improvements and a positive sales mix, despite negative exchange rate effects. EBITA achieved its highest level for a full year to date, despite challenging market conditions in a number of market segments. Exchange rate effects from the translation of foreign subsidiaries had a negative impact of SEK 122 M on EBITA compared with the preceding year.

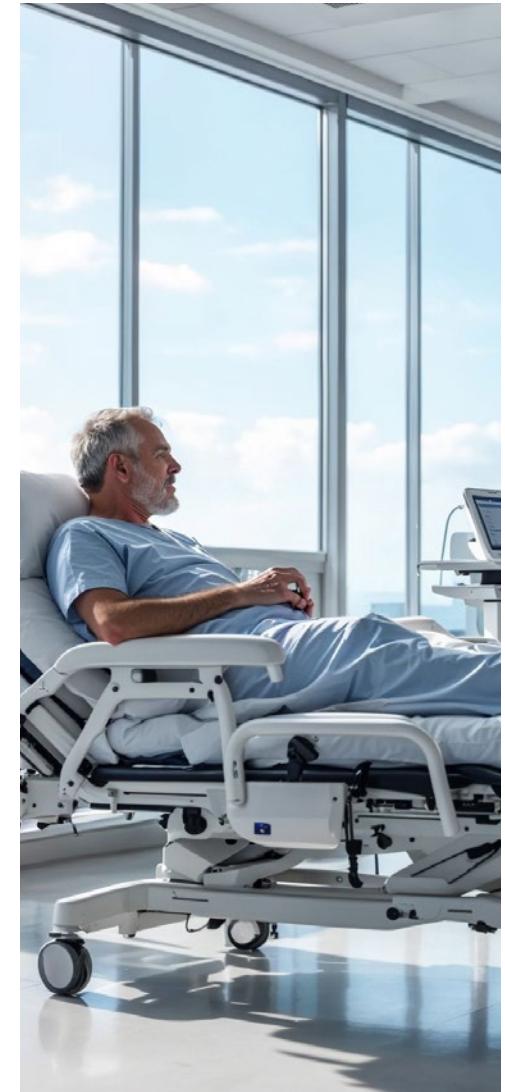
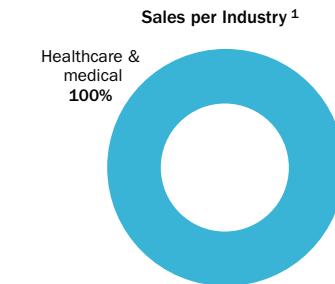
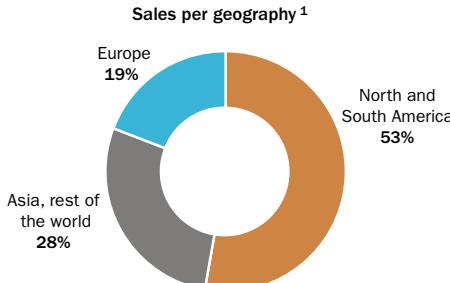
Organic sales for the quarter increased by 5 percent year-on-year. Sales of polymer solutions to the medtech market performed well in both Europe and Asia, while the North American market remained sluggish. Deliveries to the smaller life science segment noted strong global growth.

EBITA decreased slightly as a result of negative exchange rate effects. The EBITA margin improved compared with the year-earlier period, positively impacted by higher volumes. Exchange rate effects from the translation of foreign subsidiaries had a negative impact of SEK 22 M on EBITA compared with the preceding year.

FULL YEAR 2025

Organic sales for the full year increased by 6 percent compared with the preceding year. Acquisitions supported a sales increase of 16 percent. Organic sales of polymer solutions to medtech in Europe and Asia improved significantly, while sales to North America displayed a weaker performance. Deliveries to the smaller life science segment increased sharply.

EBITA and the EBITA margin increased significantly, primarily as a result of acquisitions. A new production facility in Costa Rica was opened at the end of the year. Exchange rate effects from the translation of foreign subsidiaries had a negative impact of SEK 44 M on EBITA compared with the preceding year.

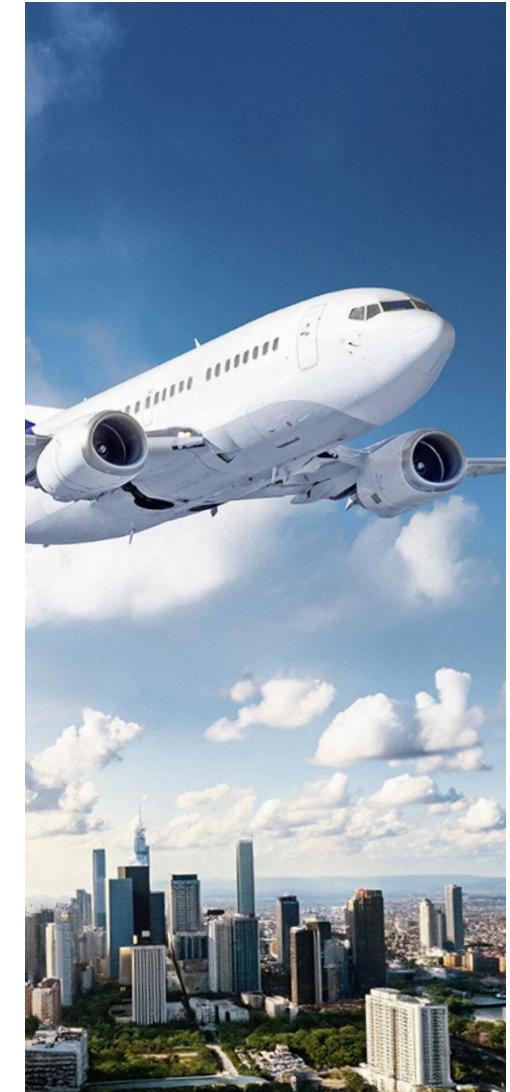
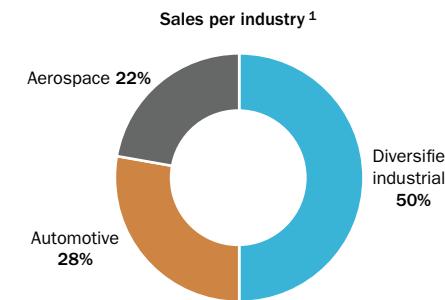
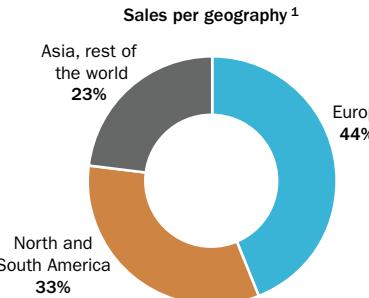
Organic sales for the quarter increased by 5 percent year-on-year. Acquisitions supported a sales increase of 3 percent. Sales to the industrials segment improved in all geographic markets. Deliveries to the automotive industry decreased mainly in Europe, but were also sluggish in other markets. The aerospace industry displayed continued significant sales growth globally.

EBITA and the EBITA margin increased slightly year-on-year, primarily as a result of improved market conditions. This despite negative exchange rate effects. The margin was negatively impacted by the sales mix and acquisitions with initially lower profitability. Exchange rate effects from the translation of foreign subsidiaries had a negative impact of SEK 71 m on EBITA compared with the year-earlier quarter.

FULL YEAR 2025

Organic sales for the full year increased by 1 percent compared with the preceding year. Acquisitions supported a sales increase of 4 percent. Organic sales in Europe declined slightly, developed positively in Asia, and were stable in North America. Sales to the industrials segment increased in Europe and Asia but declined in North America. Deliveries to the automotive industry declined in Europe and North America, but increased slightly in Asia. Sales to the aerospace industry continued to perform very well in all geographic markets.

EBITA and the EBITA margin declined somewhat as a result of challenging market conditions in a number of major market segments, changes in the sales mix and negative exchange rate effects. The margin was also negatively impacted by acquisitions with initially lower profitability. Exchange rate effects from the translation of foreign subsidiaries had a negative impact of SEK 181 m on EBITA compared with the preceding year.

Events after year-end

Trelleborg acquires tooling and automation specialist

Trelleborg Group, through its business area Trelleborg Sealing Solutions, has signed an agreement and finalized the acquisition of the Austrian company Nexus Elastomer Molds GmbH. The company provides advanced, customized tooling solutions and automated manufacturing cells, primarily for liquid silicone rubber.

Nexus Elastomer Molds is based in Eberstalzell, Austria. Trelleborg has previously partnered with Nexus in both development and production. The company adds external sales of approx-

imately SEK 160 M on a rolling twelve-month basis as of June 2025.

Nexus's expertise will strengthen and expand the capabilities of both Trelleborg Sealing Solutions and Trelleborg Medical Solutions.

The acquisition was consolidated on January 7, on the same date the press release was published.

Other news



New manufacturing facility in Vietnam

A new manufacturing facility was inaugurated in Ba Ria-Vung Tau, Vietnam, in November. The 60,000 sqm facility increases capacity for marine and infrastructure-related polymer solutions and strengthens Trelleborg's presence in the Asia-Pacific region.



Navigation software update with real-time whale alerts

Trelleborg has integrated real-time whale sighting alerts into the SafePilot Pro navigation software to reduce the risk of collisions between vessels and whales – a well-known and recurring problem in heavily trafficked ocean areas. The solution contributes to safer maritime operations and supports efforts to protect Australia's whale populations.



New medical manufacturing facility in Costa Rica

In Grecia, Costa Rica, Trelleborg has established its first manufacturing facility in Central America. The 10,000 sqm site focuses on engineered polymer solutions for medical, providing proximity to global customers in the region.



Certification confirms solution for water and wastewater pipe rehabilitation

Trelleborg has received WRc Group approval for the Pro-liner pipe rehabilitation system together with the thermocuring epoxy resin HC120+. The certification confirms the system's resistance to infiltration and its suitability for the rehabilitation of water and wastewater pipelines, demonstrating Trelleborg's technical expertise in the field.



Fully charged solutions for tomorrow's electric vehicles

Electric vehicles are now a common sight as battery technology continues to improve and extend driving range. The number of electric vehicles globally increased from just 26 million in 2023 to nearly 60 million in 2024, partly driven by government incentives and low emission zones. Range anxiety has been a challenge, but with more charging points and changed driving behaviors, this is easing. Trelleborg is investing in seals and materials that enhance battery performance, including the new CellXPro material, which reduces capacity loss over time and offers excellent chemical compatibility, supporting faster charging and greater durability. Liquid electrolyte batteries are expected to remain dominant in the coming years, even as solid-state technology promises future breakthroughs.

Trelleborg serves a broad range of customers in a variety of industries and niches. The business has a wide geographic spread. The Group has operations in around 40 countries, sales are conducted in just over 140 countries worldwide and manufacturing operations are carried out at approximately 100 production units. The business is diversified geographically and within a number of industries, which provides Trelleborg with an effective underlying risk spread.

Demand for the Group's products and solutions largely moves in line with fluctuations in global industrial production. The Group focuses on industries and geographies with good growth that can deliver consistent results even when negative economic fluctuations occur in individual industries.

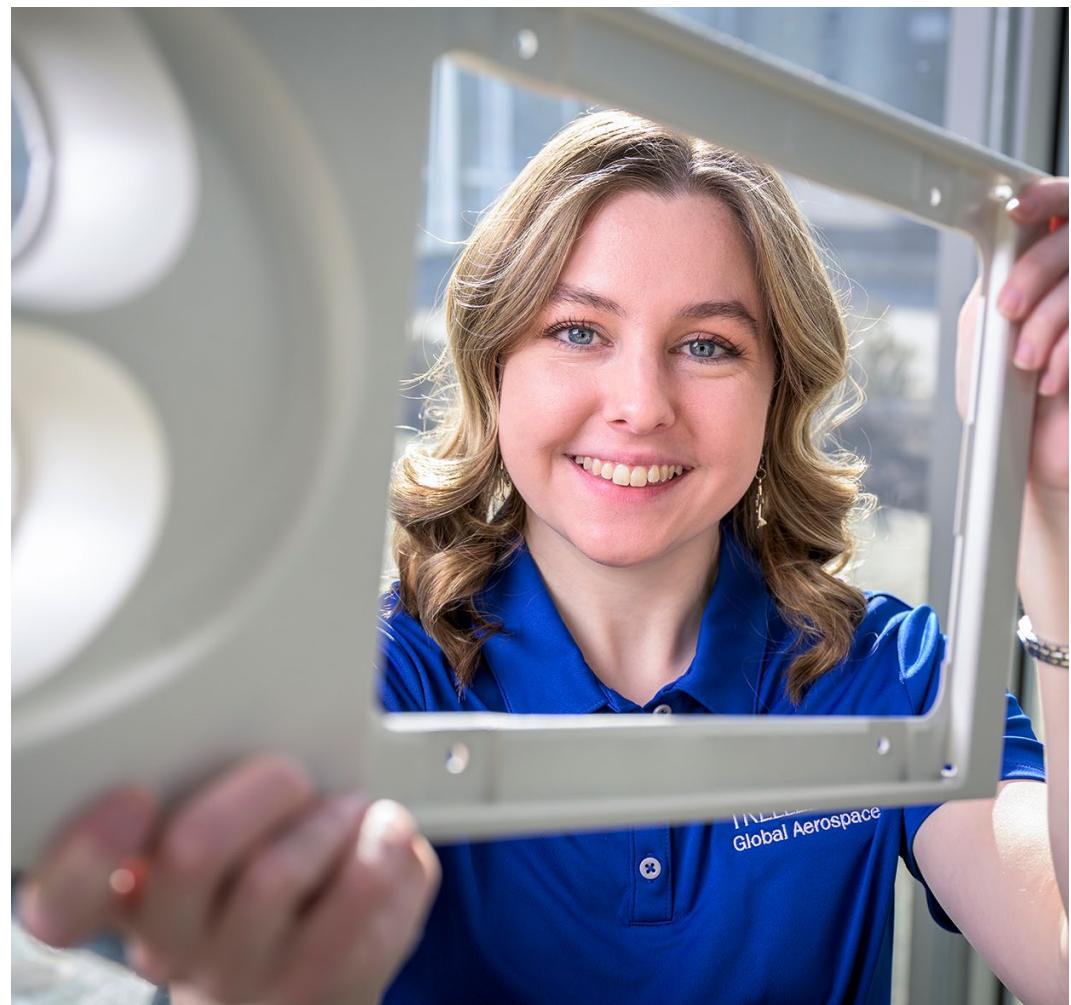
Long-term risks

Trelleborg has identified the relevant areas based on strategic risks, operational risks, regulatory compliance risks, and financial risks that may result in damage or loss with substantial impact on the entire Group and, therefore, justify management of the risk exposure at Group level.

Short-term risks

To date, the shift toward increased global trade barriers has had a limited direct impact on Trelleborg's operations, since the company's business model is based on regional production for a regional market. Our global presence also facilitates shifts in production to avoid tariffs. The starting point is to offset cost increases, owing to tariffs that cannot be avoided, with price increases. However, indirect impacts such as disruptions in the supply chain and increased costs of raw materials could negatively affect the business. Even the uncertainty that increased global trade barriers is creating could impact global economic activity.

General accounting policies

This report has been prepared in accordance with IAS 34 Interim Financial Reporting and the applicable rules of the Swedish Annual Accounts Act. Disclosures in accordance with IAS 34.16A appear in the financial statements and their accompanying notes. The Parent Company applies recommendation RFR 2, Accounting for Legal Entities of the Swedish Financial Reporting Board and Chapter 9 of the Swedish Annual Accounts Act, Interim Reports.

Accounting policies and calculation methods applied in this report are unchanged compared with those applied in the preparation of the annual and consolidated accounts for 2024. No new or revised IFRSs or interpretative statements applied as of January 1, 2025 had any material impact on the consolidated financial statements. For a more detailed description of the accounting policies applied for the Group and Parent Company in this interim report, refer to the 2024 Annual and Sustainability Report.

At the Annual General Meeting, held in April 2025, the decision was taken to introduce a new

performance share program, PSP 2025/2027, which includes the President and Group Management, whereby participants invest in Trelleborg AB shares. The participants in the PSP program can invest a maximum of 10 percent of their base salary. Each invested share entitles the holder to receive a maximum of three shares free of charge after the publication of the year-end report for the 2027 fiscal year. Allotment requires compliance with certain performance-based conditions and that the participant remains employed within the Trelleborg Group. For further information, refer to the decision taken at the Annual General Meeting on April 24, 2025. To date, the recognized costs for 2025 are not significant. The resolution on PSP 2024/2026 was passed at the Annual General Meeting on April 24, 2024. For further information, see the resolution from the Annual General Meeting. Recognized costs for 2025 and 2024 are not significant to date.

Acquisitions 2025

On January 9, 2025, through its Trelleborg Sealing Solutions business area, Trelleborg finalized the acquisition of the US company CRC Distribution. The company is a specialist distributor in polymer sealing solutions and related value-added services in hydraulics, hydropower, oil and gas, as well as for pumps and compressors. The company generates annual external sales of just over SEK 170 M.

On February 28, 2025, through its Trelleborg Industrial Solutions business area, Trelleborg finalized the acquisition of NuFlow, headquartered in Escondido, California and operating across North America. The company is a manufacturer of specialized liners, resins and equipment for small-diameter pipe repair. The company offers repair solutions for lateral and building interior pipes in both residential and commercial properties. Sales in 2024 amounted to approximately SEK 180 M.

On April 2, 2025, Trelleborg, through its Trelleborg Industrial Solutions business area, finalized the acquisition of National Gummi AB. The business portfolio comprises extruded rubber profiles and gaskets for niche construction, industrial and automotive applications. Sales in 2024 amounted to just over SEK 150 M.

On April 11, 2025, through its Trelleborg Sealing Solutions business area, Trelleborg finalized the acquisition of the US company Aero-Plastics Inc, which specializes in attractive, high-performance plastics and interior segments for the aerospace industry. Sales in 2024 amounted to approximately SEK 150 M.

On May 6, 2025, through its Trelleborg Industrial Solutions business area, Trelleborg finalized the acquisition of Sico Gesellschaft für Siliconverarbeitung mbH and Czech joint venture company Sico Silicone s.r.o. Trelleborg has been a 50/50 joint venture party in Sico Silicone since 2016. Sico develops and manufactures a range of engineered extruded and molded silicone rubber products. Consolidated sales amounted to approximately SEK 280 M in 2024.

On September 1, 2025, through its Trelleborg Sealing Solutions business area, Trelleborg finalized the acquisition of Masterseals, a Singapore-based company that specializes in sealing solutions for the energy sector and industrial applications. In 2024, the company generated sales of just over SEK 40 M.

The NuFlow acquisition comprised both an asset-transfer acquisition and the acquisition of 100 percent of the shares in a company. The Sico Silicone s.r.o. acquisition related to the remaining 50 percent of the shares of the former joint venture. Other acquisitions completed in 2025 refer to 100 percent of the shares in the respective companies. All acquisitions are expected to have a marginal impact on the Group's key figures.

Certain adjustments were made in 2025 to purchase price allocations attributable to acquisitions made in 2024.

The acquisition of Nexus Elastomer Molds GmbH that was concluded after the end of the period, see page 15, is expected to have a marginal impact on the Group's key figures. The company adds external sales of approximately SEK 160 M on a rolling twelve-month basis as of June 2025.

The goodwill recognized for 2025 was primarily attributable to synergy effects expected after the acquisition. The fair value of acquired, identifiable intangible assets is preliminarily pending final measurement of these assets.

Acquisitions 2024

On April 17, 2024, Trelleborg, through its Trelleborg Sealing Solutions business area, finalized the acquisition of the South Korean MNE Group, which consists of the companies Materials Nano Engineering and Materials Nano Solution and is primarily focused on manufacturing high-performance specialty seals for both the aftermarket and OE manufacturers of semiconductor production equipment. MNE Group generated approximately SEK 300 M in sales in 2023. The acquisition agreement stipulates that a contingent consideration may be paid as part of the transaction. The additional purchase payment is divided into two parts. The first condition relates to financial performance for 2024 and 2025, which assumes an annual improvement. The target for 2024 was achieved and indications are that the target will be achieved for 2025. The second condition is associated with sales activities in relation to the company's main customer for new materials. Also in this case, it is Trelleborg's assessment that the target will be met. The contingent consideration may be paid in a range from EUR 0 M (SEK 0 M) to a maximum of EUR 20 M (SEK 232 M at the date of acquisition). At the date of acquisition, the contingent consideration was estimated at EUR 20 M undiscounted and EUR 19 M discounted. The contingent consideration is estimated at EUR 16 M on December 31, 2025. Despite a strong market recovery, there is still some undercapacity to meet demand. The fair value of the contingent consideration has been estimated by calculating the present value of future projected cash flows. A discount rate of 2.08 percent (as of December 31, 2025) has been used in the calculations. As per December 31, 2025, the contingent consideration had increased by SEK 13 M as a result of changes in the discount rate compared to the acquisition date, but had also declined due to the changed estimate of SEK 46 M. The change in assessment had a positive impact on operating profit as non-recurring income and was recognized as an item affecting comparability.

On May 8, 2024, Trelleborg, through its Trelleborg Industrial Solutions business area, finalized the acquisition of BP-Tech Group, including Boldan and Sprayoxy, a Finnish pipe repair specialist. Sales in 2023 amounted to just over SEK 220 M.

On July 17, 2024, Trelleborg, through its Trelleborg Medical Solutions business area, finalized the acquisition of Baron Group. The company is a global leader in the manufacturing of advanced precision components. Baron Group generated sales of approximately SEK 1,000 M in 2023. The acquisition agreement stipulates that a contingent consideration may be paid as part of the transaction. The contingent consideration is subject to an improved financial performance in the third fiscal year of the acquired company. Based on the outcome since the date of acquisition and the company's plans, Trelleborg's best assessment is that the target will be achieved. The contingent consideration may be paid in a range from USD 0 M (SEK 0 M) to a maximum of USD 100 M (SEK 1,062 M at the date of acquisition). At the date of acquisition, the contingent consideration was estimated at USD 100 M undiscounted and USD 89 M discounted. The fair value of the contingent consideration has been estimated by calculating the present value of future projected cash flows. A discount rate of 3.47 percent (as of December 31, 2025) has been used in the calculations. As per December 31, 2025, the contingent consideration had increased by SEK 58 M as a result of changes in the discount rate compared to the acquisition date.

On December 4, 2024, through its Trelleborg Sealing Solutions business area, Trelleborg finalized the acquisition of Magee Plastics, a specialist in thermoplastics for the aerospace industry. Sales in 2023 amounted to SEK 230 M.

On December 12, 2024, Trelleborg finalized, through the Trelleborg Industrial Solutions business area, the acquisition of Mampaey Offshore Industries, a manufacturer of advanced solutions for the marine industry. Sales in 2023 amounted to SEK 170 M.

All acquisitions completed in 2024 refer to 100 percent of the shares in the respective companies.

At the Annual General Meeting, held in April 2025, the decision was taken to introduce a new performance share program, PSP 2025/2027, which includes the President and Group Management, whereby participants invest in Trelleborg AB shares. The participants in the PSP program can invest a maximum of 10 percent of their base salary. Each invested share entitles the holder to receive a maximum of three shares free of charge after the publication of the year-end report for the 2027 fiscal year. Allotment requires compliance with certain performance-based conditions and that the participant remains employed within the Trelleborg Group. For further information, refer to the decision taken at the Annual General Meeting on April 24, 2025. To date, the recognized costs for 2025 are not significant. The resolution on PSP 2024/2026 was passed at the Annual General Meeting on April 24, 2024. For further information, see the resolution from the Annual General Meeting. Recognized costs for 2025 and 2024 are not significant to date.
