The whisky from High Coast Distillery under the High Coast Whisky brand has been available since 2014. The Origins series with Berg, Älv, Timmer and Hav is already a big seller among the premium brands. At the production and visitor facility in Bjärträ, Sweden, whisky is produced seven days a week and more than 20,000 casks are maturing in the warehouses. High Coast Whisky is currently sold in about ten countries. The company's shares are traded on Nasdaq First North Growth Market. Turnover is about SEK 60 million excluding alcohol tax and the business employs about 25 people.
