INTERIM REPORT JANUARY – SEPTEMBER 2025

Idun's net sales increased by 4.5% (-2.2% organic), and EBITA rose by 5.6% (-9.2% organic) during the quarter. For the last twelve months, net sales increased by 3.7% organically and EBITA by 0.2% organically. Earnings per share increased to SEK 3.6 (2.9). Idun invested in the quarter in Barem. Interagro Skog, which was acquired at the end of 2024, contributed to the profit growth in the quarter.

- Cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK 32.6 million (41.3)
- Idun, through Fredahl Rydéns Holding, on 3 July, acquired 75% of the shares in Barem OÜ ("Barem"). Barem, together with its subsidiary Puidu Taavet, is one of the leading suppliers to the funeral industry in Finland and Estonia.

The first nine months 2025

- Net sales increased by 3.6% to SEK 1,683.0 million (1,624.8). Organic growth was 0.4%
- Gross profit amounted to SEK 1,016.3 million (965.2)
- EBITDA amounted to SEK 275.8 million (268.1)
- Operating profit EBITA amounted to SEK 240.4 million (234.4). Organic growth was -2.6%.
- Operating profit EBITA attributable to Idun's common shareholders amounted to SEK 199.5 million (178.4)
- Earnings per share adjusted for goodwill after dilution amounted to SEK 11.0 (9.5)
- Cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK 158.0 million (171.2)
- Idun, through Idun Mekaniska Komponenter AB, on 21 February, increased its ownership in Eugen Wiberger AB by 15 percentage points. Idun previously owned 71% of the company's shares and, after the transaction, owns 86% of the company.
- On 5 March 2025, Idun entered into a loan agreement with Danske Bank and SEB, and also gave notice of early redemption of the 2022/2026 bonds with ISIN SE0017131170. The redemption date for the bonds was 31 March 2025. The unsecured loan agreement includes two credit facilities: a term loan of SEK 550 million and a revolving credit facility of SEK 450 million. The loan agreement has a maturity of three years, with the option to extend by two years. In connection with the loan agreement, in addition to the bonds, approximately SEK 304 million of existing acquisition loans were repaid. Certain existing bank debt, mainly real estate facilities, will remain. In total, an annual reduction in interest expenses of approximately SEK 20 million is expected, while achieving a more efficient and flexible capital structure.
- Idun, through Idun Industrial Components AB, on 23 April, increased its ownership in 2B Best Business AB by 28 percentage points. Idun previously owned 70% of the company's shares and, after the transaction, owns 98% of the company. The shares were acquired for approximately SEK 56.5 million, corresponding to an EBITA multiple of about 7x.

Last twelve months

- Net sales increased by 3.7% to SEK 2,250.2 million (2,169.7). Organic growth was 1.3%
- Gross profit amounted to SEK 1,363.5 million (1,302.3)
- EBITDA amounted to SEK 363.3 million (349.7)
- Operating profit EBITA amounted to SEK 314.4 million (303.2). Organic growth was 0.2%

- Operating profit EBITA attributable to Idun's common shareholders amounted to SEK 258.0 million (231.2)
- Earnings per share adjusted for goodwill after dilution amounted to SEK 13.3 (12.3)
- Cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK 243.2 million (258.6)
- Idun has increased its ownership in P&L Nordic AB by almost 27 percentage points, from 70% to nearly 97%. Idun has also increased its ownership in Eugen Wiberger AB by 15 percentage points, and in 2B Best Business AB by 28 percentage points. If these transactions had been completed on 1 October 2024, EBITA attributable to Idun's common shareholders would have increased by approximately SEK 5.4 million.

As Idun applies K3 and not IFRS, significant amortization of goodwill arises in the Group. Under K3, goodwill from acquisitions is amortized on a straight-line basis, unlike IFRS, where only impairment testing is performed. Since most of Idun's peers report according to IFRS, Idun has chosen to present results adjusted for goodwill amortization to facilitate comparison with other IFRS-reporting companies.

Because there is co-ownership among key individuals and, in some cases, former owners in Idun's group companies, the portion of EBITA and net debt attributable to Idun's common shareholders is presented as supplementary information. This addition is made to facilitate valuation of Idun's common shares

CEO'S MESSAGE

During the third quarter of the year, revenue increased by 4.5% to SEK 521 million (499) and operating profit EBITA rose by 5.6% to SEK 73.6 million (69.7). Earnings per share (adjusted for goodwill, after dilution) increased by more than 20% to SEK 3.6 (from SEK 2.9 in Q3 2024). During the quarter, we acquired, through Fredahl Rydéns, the Estonian coffin manufacturer Barem, and Stegaföretagen completed an add-on acquisition of Prestec (products and services within high-pressure and sewer flushing).

The trend of a somewhat subdued economic environment during the year continues, where a turnaround has long been said to be about six months away. Despite several group companies facing a weaker market, Idun as a group has, over the past twelve months, managed to achieve organic growth in both revenue and earnings, although at a modest level, and a significant increase in earnings per share. In this external environment, we have also, step by step, strengthened our gross margin, including during this quarter, which has partly offset the impact of negative organic growth and lays a stronger foundation for future profitability.

In the third quarter, we saw weaker results in several group companies primarily within Service and Maintenance, which largely have the Swedish process industry as their customer base. This applies, for example, to Triton (service and new production of rollers), ILEMA (air emission measurements), and Ståthöga MA Teknik (maintenance for heavy industry). Stegaföretagen (active within, among other things, vehicle washing and related operations) also experienced a more cautious investment climate during the quarter. For the Group as a whole, organic sales decreased by -2.2%, while organic EBITA decreased by -9.2%. This is, of course, something we are not satisfied with.

At the same time, we can note that our companies within Manufacturing have performed more strongly so far this year. For example, all of our operations within the green industries are performing strongly (LMI, Norotec, and Interagro Skog). Interagro Skog, which we acquired in the autumn of 2024, delivered an excellent quarter with operating profit exceeding SEK 10 million, representing a significant earnings increase compared with the same quarter last year (although not included in the organic figures presented, since the company was not owned twelve months ago). The group company Wiberger (mechanical components and machine parts) is also performing very strongly, as a result of, among other things, a broadened product range and expansion in Norway.

An effect of the significant reduction in our financing costs (approximately SEK 5 million lower per quarter now following the refinancing at the beginning of 2025) is that it has contributed to the increase in our earnings per share. During the first half of 2026, we will evaluate options for our remaining outstanding bond, which can be redeemed in mid-2026. If the current financing market does not change materially, there is likely an opportunity to further reduce our interest expenses by approximately SEK 8 million on an annual basis over time.

The persistently challenging macroeconomic climate necessitates ongoing cost-adjustment efforts in those group companies where necessary. In parallel, we are continuing active pricing efforts, as well as investments in machinery, IT systems, competence, and product development to increase our efficiency and ensure the continued growth and positive earnings development of our companies.

Looking ahead, the short-term outlook is somewhat mixed, where some markets and customer segments show positive signs, while others remain sluggish. No clear economic improvement is yet visible. However, we are confident that our group companies are well-positioned for 2026, which has good potential to be a strong year, regardless of whether we experience an economic tailwind or not. Regarding future investments in new operations, Idun Industrier has a strong financial position, and we continue to see good opportunities for new acquisitions, both in the short and long term.

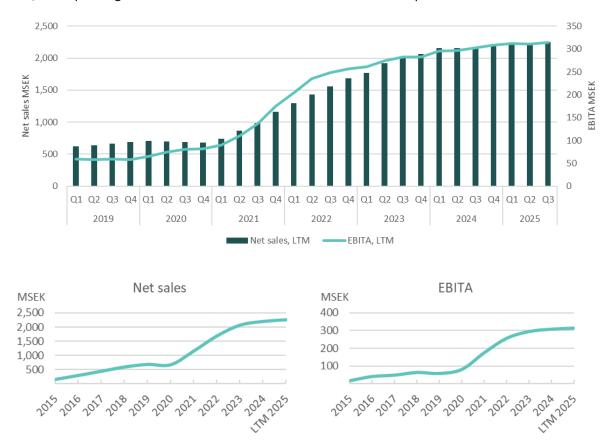
FINANCIAL DEVELOPMENT OF THE GROUP

Net sales

During the third quarter, the Group's net sales amounted to SEK 521.1 million (498.6), representing an increase of 4.5%. Organic growth in the companies owned throughout the entire comparison period was -2.2%, corresponding to SEK -10.8 million. The increase attributable to acquisitions was SEK 33.3 million.

During the first nine months, the Group's net sales amounted to SEK 1,683.0 million (1,624.8), representing an increase of 3.6%. Organic growth in the companies owned throughout the entire comparison period was 0.4%, corresponding to SEK 7.1 million. The increase attributable to acquisitions was SEK 51.1 million.

For the last twelve months, the Group's net sales amounted to SEK 2,250.2 million (2,169.7), representing an increase of 3.7%. Organic growth in the companies owned throughout the entire comparison period was 1.3%, corresponding to SEK 28.9 million. The increase attributable to acquisitions was SEK 51.5 million.



Results

During the third quarter, the Group's operating profit EBITA increased to SEK 73.6 million (69.7), representing an increase of 5.6%. From the companies owned by Idun throughout the entire comparison period, the impact on earnings was negative by SEK 6.9 million, and the organic EBITA development compared with the comparison period was -9.2%. There was a positive effect from acquired companies of SEK 11.1 million. The parent company's costs increased by SEK 0.3 million during the period.

During the first nine months, the Group's operating profit EBITA increased to SEK 240.4 million (234.4), representing an increase of 2.6%. The positive impact from acquired companies amounted to SEK 15.9 million, and the negative impact from companies owned throughout the entire comparison period was SEK -6.4 million. The organic EBITA growth was -2.6% for the companies owned throughout the entire comparison period. The parent company's costs increased by SEK 3.5 million, of which SEK 1 million was attributable to transaction costs in connection with the new loan agreement.

For the last twelve months, the Group's operating profit EBITA increased to SEK 314.4 million (303.2), representing an increase of 3.7%. The positive impact from acquired companies amounted to SEK 15.2 million, and from companies owned throughout the entire comparison period SEK 0.8 million. The organic EBITA growth was 0.2% for the companies owned throughout the entire comparison period. The parent company's costs increased by SEK 4.8 million.

Balance sheet

The Group's total assets amounted as of 30 September 2025 to SEK 2,267.2 million (2,347.6), with figures in parentheses referring to 30 September 2024. Cash and bank balances amounted to SEK 290.6 million (391.3). Trade receivables amounted to SEK 317.8 million (318.6), and inventories to SEK 401.1 million (395.0). Total equity amounted to SEK 810.0 million (918.1), of which SEK 0.7 million (0.7) was share capital. The equity ratio amounted to 35.7% (39.1). The Group's non-current liabilities amounted to SEK 877.8 million (819.3). Current liabilities amounted to SEK 474.9 million (487.8), of which SEK 152.0 million (142.3) were trade payables.

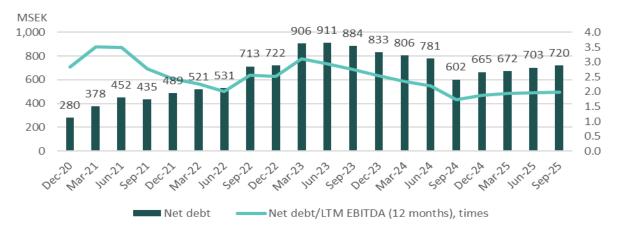
Cash flow

Cash flow from operating activities after changes in working capital during the period amounted to SEK 32.6 million (41.3). Cash flow from investing activities amounted to SEK -42.0 million (-52.9) and consisted mainly of investments in subsidiaries as well as investments in fixed assets during the period and the comparison period. During the period, cash flow from financing activities amounted to SEK -16.1 million (220.8) and mainly consisted of loan repayments during the period and a new share issue in the comparison period. Total cash flow for the period amounted to SEK -25.5 million (209.1). Considering that Idun has increased its ownership in several of the Group's companies, Idun expects the total dividend on a rolling twelve-month basis to Idun's shareholders and minority interests to be approximately SEK 50 million per year (given current minority holdings and dividends on Idun's common shares).

Cash flow from operating activities after changes in working capital during the first nine months amounted to SEK 158.0 million (171.2). Cash flow from investing activities amounted to SEK -169.7 million (-78.5) and consisted mainly of investments in subsidiaries and fixed assets during the first nine months and in the comparison period. During the first nine months, cash flow from financing activities amounted to SEK -92.7 million (22.5) and mainly consisted of loan repayments and dividends paid during the period, and new share issues, loan repayments, and dividends paid during the comparison period. Total cash flow for the first nine months amounted to SEK -104.4 million (115.2).

Net debt

The graph below shows the Group's total net debt as of 30 September 2025. At the end of the period, the Group had a net debt of SEK 720.0 million, which is an increase of SEK 17.1 million during the quarter. At the end of the period, cash and bank balances amounted to SEK 290.6 million. Net debt also includes provisions for contingent consideration of SEK 24.1 million (the provision corresponds to 100% of the maximum earn-out according to agreement), for which no payment was made during the period. An additional provision of SEK 5.1 million was made during the period.



The above debt ratio is not pro forma; acquired businesses are consolidated from the acquisition date of each respective investment, and it takes twelve months before EBITDA on an annual basis is included in last twelve-months (LTM) EBITDA. The EBITDA used in the calculation excludes a positive revaluation effect of SEK 12.0 million net for the periods ending December 2023 to September 2024.

Investments during the period

Idun, through Fredahl Rydéns Holding, on 3 July, acquired 75% of the shares in Barem OÜ ("Barem"). Barem, together with its subsidiary Puidu Taavet, is one of the leading suppliers to the funeral industry in Finland and Estonia. The company, with approximately 35 employees, has a turnover of about SEK 30 million and an EBITA of approximately SEK 3 million.

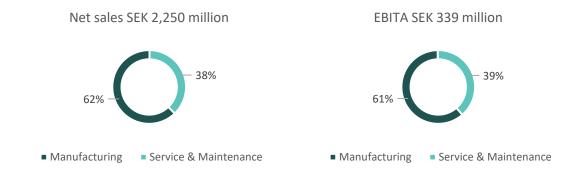
Stegaföretagen, in which Idun owns 49%, on 11 July, acquired 76% of the shares in Prestec i Stockholm AB. Prestec offers products and services within high-pressure and sewer flushing. Prestec has a turnover of approximately SEK 35 million and an EBITA of approximately SEK 3 million (Idun's share of turnover SEK 17.5 million and EBITA SEK 1.5 million).

IDUN'S BUSINESS AREAS

Idun's 18 group companies are organized into two business areas: Manufacturing and Service & Maintenance.

The business areas' share of Idun's net sales and earnings

Manufacturing

The Manufacturing business area comprises the group companies operating primarily within the manufacturing industry, with production in Sweden or abroad. Group companies within this business area include: Intermercato – machine accessories, LMI – micronutrients and forest protection, Prident – product media, including sports water bottles, Kjellbergs – actuators, Sjöbergs – workbenches and related products, TURAB – production and service of hydropower turbines, BIA – water treatment products, Wiberger – machine components, Culina Products – stainless steel interiors and equipment for commercial kitchens and restaurants, 2B – industrial components, Fredahl Rydéns – products for the funeral industry.

Net sales during the third quarter amounted to SEK 324.1 million (294.9) and EBITA amounted to SEK 53.6 million (41.5). Net sales for the first nine months amounted to SEK 1,067.4 million (1,001.8) and EBITA amounted to SEK 168.0 million (149.2). Net sales for the last twelve months amounted to SEK 1,404.3 million (1,335.3) and EBITA amounted to SEK 207.4 million (187.9).

During the past twelve months, the following acquisitions have been made within the Manufacturing business area: Interagro Skog AB (results and balance sheet consolidated as of 31 October 2024) and Barem OÜ ("Barem") together with its subsidiaries (results and balance sheet consolidated as of 1 July 2025).

Service & Maintenance

The Service & Maintenance business area comprises Idun's operations that operate wholly or predominantly within service and maintenance services. Group companies within the Service & Maintenance business area include: Stegaföretagen, EKAB, Better Business, Ståthöga MA Teknik, P&L Nordic, ILEMA, and Triton. Stega provides full-service solutions within vehicle washing. EKAB offers service and preventive maintenance of power facilities (mainly high-voltage switchgear). Better Business provides control services, age control, mystery shopping, and various security-related services. Ståthöga MA Teknik provides maintenance for heavy industry. P&L Nordic offers a learning and competence management tool for industrial companies and vocational upper secondary school programs. ILEMA is the Swedish market

leader in air emission measurements and performs measurements and analyses of air and flue gas emissions. Triton provides services in maintenance and production of small and medium-sized rollers, mainly for Swedish industrial customers.

Net sales during the third quarter amounted to SEK 197.0 million (203.7) and EBITA amounted to SEK 25.7 million (33.6). Net sales for the first nine months amounted to SEK 615.6 million (623.0) and EBITA amounted to SEK 91.6 million (101.0). Net sales for the last twelve months amounted to SEK 845.9 million (834.4) and EBITA amounted to SEK 131.7 million (135.2).

During the past twelve months, the following acquisition has taken place within the Service & Maintenance business area: Prestec i Stockholm AB (results and balance sheet consolidated as of 1 July 2025).

¹ During the fourth quarter of 2023, a revaluation of contingent consideration linked to earn-outs was carried out, which had a positive impact on the reported result of SEK 12.0 million net. To increase transparency and comparability between periods, this positive revaluation effect has been excluded from the key figures presented above.

Parent company

The parent company comprises the central costs of the parent company Idun Industrier AB (publ) and related activities, as well as other non-operational items that arise within the Group. Idun's parent company costs mainly consist of salaries and related expenses for personnel at the parent company level, which forms the Group's central investment organization, conducts due diligence processes in investments, represents the Group on the boards of its subsidiaries, and also includes the Group's central finance function. Idun performs the vast majority of due diligence and investment-related work with its own staff, which, in the company's view, strengthens continuity and comparability in analysis, the quality of decision-making, and is more cost-effective than using external consultants. For the last twelve months, EBITA amounted to SEK -24.7 million (-19.9). The parent company's total assets amounted to SEK 1,397.5 million (1,078.9) and liabilities to SEK 854.9 million (550.5). Equity amounted to SEK 542.6 million, corresponding to an equity ratio of 38.8%.

Expected future development and significant risks and uncertainties

A strong focus and a high market share within one or a few niches is a distinguishing feature that Idun's group companies share, and it is a key element in our investment philosophy. High market shares often also imply an offering that is difficult for competitors to replicate. Our goal is to continue acquiring new group companies and add-on acquisitions for existing subsidiaries, as well as ensuring that our existing group companies continue to perform well. Management's and the Board of Directors' assessment is that risks and uncertainties that could significantly affect the assessment of the expected future development are primarily related to the political and macroeconomic risks commented on below.

Idun's main risk factors consist of market risks such as changes in the general macroeconomic environment and geopolitical conflicts. Furthermore, the Group is exposed to operational risks, such as customer, supplier, and quality risks. The Group is also exposed to financial risks, including currency, interest rate, and credit risks. Management continuously monitors developments and evaluates risks related to the markets and demand for the group companies in order to take measures when necessary. The ongoing war in, among other places, Ukraine, brings — in addition to the human tragedy — a world with significant uncertainty. However, the Idun Group's direct risks related to ongoing wars and conflicts, as well as tariff disputes and trade wars, are limited. Given the higher-than-normal level of uncertainty in our external environment, but also as we continue to see many opportunities for acquisition-driven growth of successful small and medium-sized companies with strong market positions in their respective niches, it is reassuring that the Idun Group maintains good liquidity.

OTHER INFORMATION

Share capital

As of the date of this report, Idun has two share classes, A and B shares. The A shares are unlisted, and the B shares have been listed on Nasdaq First North Growth Market since 25 March 2021.

The number of outstanding shares at the end of the period and as of the date of this report amounts to 11,512,373 shares, divided into 3,110,240 A shares and 8,402,133 B shares. As of the end of the reporting period, there were outstanding warrants entitling to subscribe for 88,000 B shares, distributed as follows 31,800 of series 2023/2026 1, 4,000 of series 2023/2026 2 (both with an exercise price of SEK 257.38), 28,400 of series 2024/2027 1, 3,000 of series 2024/2027 2 (both with an exercise price of SEK 260.68), 18,800 of series 2025/2028 1, 2,000 of series 2025/2028 2 (both with an exercise price of SEK 428.07). As of 30 September 2025, the warrants of series 2023/2026 1 and 2 and 2024/2027 1 and 2 resulted in a dilution effect of 0.76%.

Financial Calendar

NOTES

Accounting principles

This interim report has been prepared in accordance with the Swedish Annual Accounts Act. The applied accounting and valuation principles are consistent with the K3 framework and remain unchanged compared with the most recently submitted annual report, as well as the general guidelines of the Swedish Accounting Standards Board, BFNAR 2012:1. The company's accounting principles are described in the most recently published annual report.

Seasonal variations

In certain group companies, there are clear seasonal variations; however, at the Group level, there are currently no significant seasonal variations.

Related party transactions

During the period, Idun has not entered into any related party transactions that have materially affected the Group's financial results or position. For more information about related parties, please refer to the Annual Report for 2024, Note 38 — *Transactions with Related Parties*.

Estimates and assumptions

Estimates and assumptions are evaluated continuously and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are considered reasonable under current circumstances.

There are no significant sources of uncertainty in estimates or assumptions as of the date of this report that are deemed to entail a significant risk of material adjustment to the reported values of assets and liabilities within the next twelve months.

Definitions

Gross profit – Net sales and other operating income less the cost of raw materials and supplies, and goods for resale.

Gross margin (%) – Gross profit as a percentage of net sales.

EBITDA – Earnings before interest, taxes, and depreciation/amortization of tangible and intangible fixed assets.

EBITDA-margin (%) – EBITDA as a percentage of net sales.

Operating profit EBITA – Earnings before interest, taxes, and amortization of intangible fixed assets.

Operating profit EBITA attributable to Idun's common shareholders – EBITA attributable to the parent company's shareholders.

EBITA-margin (%) – EBITA as a percentage of net sales.

Profit for the period adjusted for goodwill – Profit for the period attributable to the parent company's shareholders, adjusted by adding back the parent company shareholders' share of amortization of goodwill and customer relationships, adjusted for deferred tax.

Number of employees – Average number of employees during the period.

Number of shares – Average number of outstanding shares during the period.

Equity ratio (%) – Total equity as a percentage of total assets.

Net debt – Long-term and short-term interest-bearing liabilities and provisions for contingent consideration, less cash and cash equivalents.

Net debt attributable to Idun's common shareholders – Long-term and short-term interest-bearing liabilities and provisions for contingent consideration, less cash and cash equivalents, attributable to the parent company's shareholders.

Earnings per share before dilution – Profit for the period attributable to the parent company's shareholders divided by the average number of outstanding shares during the period.

Earnings per share after dilution – Profit for the period attributable to the parent company's shareholders divided by the average number of outstanding shares during the period, adjusted for potential dilutive shares from issued options.

Earnings per share adjusted for goodwill before dilution – Profit for the period attributable to the parent company's shareholders, adjusted by adding back the parent company shareholders' share of amortization of goodwill and customer relationships, adjusted for deferred tax, divided by the average number of outstanding shares during the period.

Earnings per share adjusted for goodwill after dilution – Profit for the period attributable to the parent company's shareholders, adjusted by adding back the parent company shareholders' share of amortization of goodwill and customer relationships, adjusted for deferred tax, divided by the average number of outstanding shares during the period, adjusted for potential dilutive shares from issued options.
