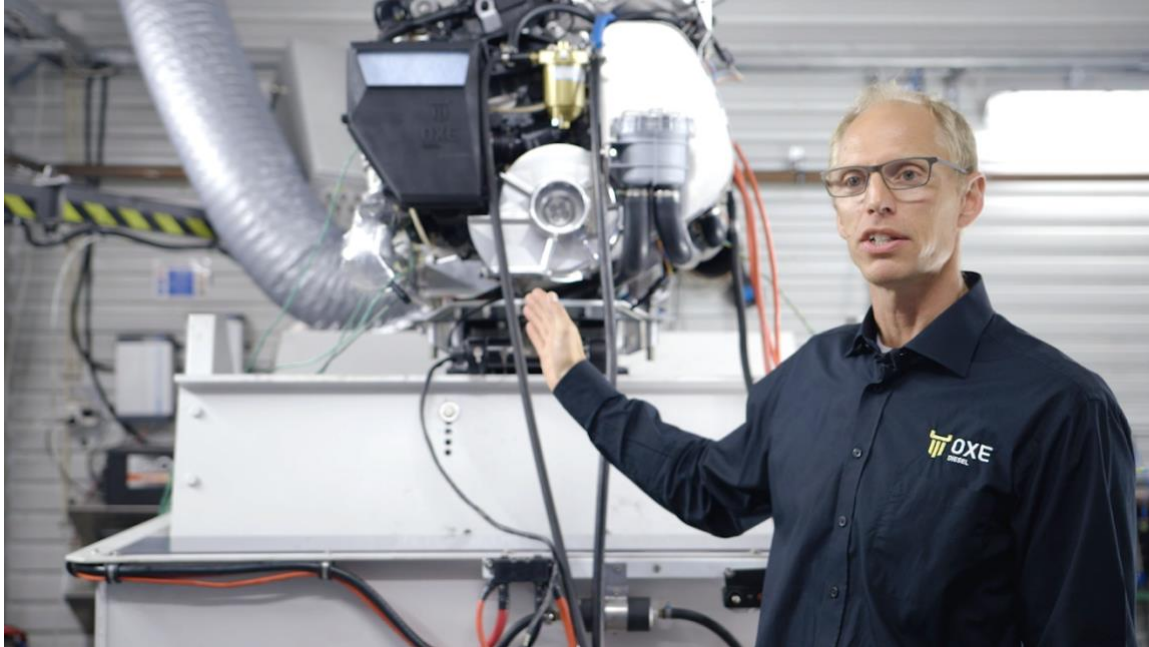


Cimco Marine AB (publ.) appoints of Per Wigren as CTO
